#### **NATURE CORNER**

Those involved in the Killiney red squirrel conservation project were very happy to find out in July that the researchers had identified two of the females as having recently lactated, meaning they had both given birth. Although too soon to be optimistic about the long term success it was a great relief after all the effort and expertise that had gone into the project to find two new red squirrel families were in the woodlands. More of the released squirrels may well have given birth but since their radio collars were removed their presence can only be ascertained by reported sightings.

All the latest findings had been announced at a very interesting talk in the Heritage Centre. Will Carr one of the researchers had said he would check inside the squirrel boxes using a Endoscope, a tiny camera at the end of a flexible lead which can be put into tiny spaces and will display the image on a laptop. This is ideal for

putting into the entrance hole of nestboxes, which might be mounted eight or ten feet up a tree, without disturbing any potential inhabitants.

The following morning after the meeting I was walking in the wood hoping to get a glance of a squirrel but also checking out another secretive family living in the woodlands. A few months before my companion, Lucy, had spotted a nest above us in a small Douglas Fir tree with a tail protruding from it. At first we thought it might have been a Jay's nest but when we blew up a photo we'd taken we could see barring on the underside of the tail identifying it as a female sparrowhawk. Subsequently we watched the male coming in bringing food to the female as she sat on eggs, later watching her perched on the nest and evidently feeding small chicks.

A friend of ours had been in touch with a Wildlife Ranger from Wicklow who, along with members of a Raptor group, has been trying to ring the chicks of as many birds of prey as they can find nesting. They came out to the nest on Killiney Hill to ring the chicks. We were fairly sure there were four chicks in the nest and they were at the perfect age, big enough to have rings put on their legs but not developed enough that they might try to jump or fly out of the nest.

The ranger arrived with her two companions with climbing gear and notebooks and equipment to record their findings. The nest was in a small tree and since the bird's wellbeing is always the highest priority one of the raptor group climbed the adjoining much bigger tree then lowered himself down a few feet above the nest. He reached in and plucked out the chicks one by one placed them in a bag and very carefully lowered them to his companion on the ground while he remained suspended from the tree.

The chicks were weighed and the disparate weights revealed them to be two males and two females, the females will eventually grow to be almost twice the size of males. Their wings and legs were measured and then the rings were placed on their legs a perpetual record of their origin if they are ever trapped again or recovered.

When all the recording was done they were put into individual bags. Although these little

guys weren't distressed, birds generally calm down when in the dark and keeping them in separate bags reduces any chance of them inadvertently scraping each others eyes. The bags were put into a bigger bag which was raised up on the pulley and carefully replaced in the nest.

We watched them for the following days growing rapidly often standing perilously on the edge of what seemed a very small shallow nest. But thankfully they all survived and on this morning, they were all out of the nest and flying. They had been balls of fluff with a few adult feathers emerging when they were ringed only nine days before but were now full adult size. Although all young birds have a limited survival rate these looked as well as they could and have every chance of doing ok. Since only two sparrowhawk chicks had fledged last year for four to fledge this year was a great success for the parents.

I'd been looking at two of the young sparrowhawks perched close to each other on an

oak tree and minutes after I left them I met Will who had arrived in the wood with the endoscope and was checking out the nestboxes. I was able to join him while he checked out two of the boxes and in the second box, the one we had previously seen a red going into, we were able to look at an empty nest lined with moss that the adult squirrel had brought in as bedding. Will told me what sometimes happens is the mother squirrel will carry the young (baby squirrels are known as kittens) to another dray. Let's hope they're safe somewhere

and we might yet see them moving through the branches. As I walked back with Will we stopped to look where I'd seen the two young sparrowhawks and they were still there. Then we noticed the two other juveniles were in the same tree, four sparrowhawks sitting quietly in the same tree until mum or dad comes home with prey when they will set up an almighty racket demanding to be fed.

A sound I don't think I'd heard in years made a very welcome return at the beginning of the July heatwave. The sound of masses of buzzing insects, a sound almost confined to the past when we used get proper summers and the shimmering heat of midday would have its own soundtrack of thousands of humming bees and hoverflies. In this case though the humming was coming from above and not from a very traditional source either. A eucalyptus tree was in flower and these nectar rich flowers attracted a cacophony of buzzing bees who, at time of writing, had still been coming to the same tree for over ten days.

# TIDY TOWNS REPORT TO COMMUNITY COUNCIL AUGUST 2013

Summer is now in full swing and Dalkey is looking it's glorious best, putting forward a magnificent display for all visitors.

The sun has brought everyone out to enjoy the town but also increased the litter left at our beauty spots. Please bring home your litter and dispose of it responsibly. Dalkey's beauty spots will not stay beautiful for long if they end up as dumps

The following letter was received from DLRCC and we would like to bring it to the attention of our residents. It is only for communal residential green waste. The committee have some reservations about the expectation by DLRCC that residents groups are expected to remove communal waste, but we are enclosing the letter as received:.

#### Dear Resident Associations,

I would like to clarify the procedure for disposing of Green Waste FREE OF CHARGE at the Ballyogan Recycling Centre.

The scheme operates in the following manner:

- Resident Associations can benefit from this initiative to a maximum of 5 car-loads per year.
- The attached application must be completed and returned via email to deaton@dlrcoco.ie or jpowderly@dlrcoco.ie (dmunter@dlrcoco.ie and pmaher@dlrcoco.ie) alternatively you can phone the Environment Department on 2054817 to request authorisation and to supply the necessary vehicular and delivery date details.
- Authorisation will then be confirmed via email (this may take a couple of days so please allow plenty of time)
- Once authorisation is approved (you will receive an email confirmation) you may take your car load of garden waste to Ballyogan Recycling Centre on the date requested. The staff on site will be in possession of the details supplied and will admit you to the site assuming vehicular details match those on the application form.

Please note: the waste must be presented in the **BLUE** community clean-up bags (which we supply) and the **BLUE** bags must be retained when the contents are emptied into the Green Waste containers provided.

This waste must be from Tidy District related work and not personal garden waste.

Any resident association who fails to receive authorisation prior to taking the waste to Ballyogan may have this offer withdrawn.

This new scheme is being operated on a trial basis and if successful will be retained, therefore we ask you all to adhere to the scheme as outlined above.

#### No green waste will be accepted on a FREE OF CHARGE at Ballyogan Recycling Centre without prior authorisation.

If you have any queries please feel free to contact Dean Eaton or John Powderly who will be delighted to assist you as best we can.

The Tidy Towns committee hopes everyone in Dalkey is enjoying all the advantages of Dalkey- sur- mer in the sun.

Litter patrols continue on Tuesdays and Saturdays at 10.30 am outside Select Stores and on Thursdays at Dillon's Park, also at 10.30 a.m. All are welcome.



### **MY GARDEN** by Philippa Thomas

August truly is a month of plenty and High Summer is when all our hopes. aspirations and desires invested in our past gardening year should be repaid: Of course, nothing quite always goes according to plan sometimes our recently bought plants fail to perform, perhaps due to our weathering agents, soil, pests and diseases, etc. But without these challenges, it wouldn't be gardening, would it? The other side of this is when cherished projects work out achievement sense of our is overwhelming.

No doubt we all have our own triumphs, right now, but remember nothing stands still. Bulbs can be sown now, for 'Autumn Glory'. Why not choose one peculiar specimen, - something that you know nothing about; therein lies mystery, hope, life - perfection. I bought a few unusual bulbs at Bloom, last year, various Gingers and Araseemas, etc.



Planting honeysuckle on a wooden fence, pergola or old tree stump, is pretty idyllic for the simple needs of this twining climber or woodbine.

They did zilch, simply nothing, last summer; however, this year, right now they are all growing pretty well in their various terracotta pots (that have loads of crockery at their bases), I can only imagine, next summer, they should develop into much stronger and more exciting plants.

So, from soothing greens to zingy, magenta, burgundies, bronzes, oranges, etc., colour can change the whole mood of a garden. Many of our late summer flowers have a special richness and depth of colour. Then the odd brash, gaudy even gawky flowers almost say, 'please look at us'. Fuchsias, Hydrangeas, and Hypericums, then Phlox, Penstemons. Campanulas are slowly giving way to all those yellow daisy-like flowers and smoky browns. Our summer bedding containers Borders and Roses are all at their peak.

Did you know that the dark heavy weight of summer foliage on our trees and shrubs traps the sunshine in order to make buds and flowers for next spring and then ripens this years seeds?

At present, vegetables and fruits are ripening including Blackcurrants, Plums, Raspberries, Grapes, Tomatoes, Peppers, Chillies, Aubergines, Cucumbers and our first Apples later on this month. There is still time to sow quick developers, such as Radish, Rocket, Lettuce, Chinese Cabbage, Spinach, White Turnips, etc. Make sure to thin as early as possible to give seedlings a chance to grow rapidly: every single day counts.

The skill and fun of managing any garden is in trying to make it look good every single day of the year. This can be tricky on a very wet dark December day but very possible at every

hour of an August day - its best to cut back hard untidy herbaceous perennials - not to cling to the last lingering flowers. It's better to create space so that a second flush can flourish, sooner.


Shape and form are the unsung heroes of the garden. Yes, flowers can hog the limelight wooing us for perhaps a few short weeks with their darling faces, however there is a whole new world out there if you so wish to decide to appreciate foliage. There is harmony, drama and peace in beautiful foliage. Spikes are definite and make a statement, don't they invite our eyes to rise and fall, preventing us from flashing haphazardly across our borders, Irises, Daylilies, Red Hot Pokers, the super evergreen blue-grey leaves of Kniphofia Caulescens look so marvellous, presently. Pot them, dot them, group them or weave them ..... they will always stand out from the crowd. The recent trend towards tropical and Mediterranean style planting has brought some amazing plants into focus. Some of these plants look as if they've landed from another planet, - almost alien like! The bold, sculptural Agave Americana can be seen in many a pot. Each fat succulent blue leaf is edged with sharp barbs and ends in a daggerlike needle, that are highly dangerous. A

brightly jewelled bead could be threaded through the tip to ensure safety. There are so many leaf types to choose from such as Phormiums, Cordylines, Yuccas Beschorneria Yuccoides, has no sharp points. Astelia Chathamica or Silver Pear, its foliage is ribbed and thickly textured and its leaves are coated in a 'silver' dust, almost like a metallic effect, it is so dramatic.

Finally, the scent of our native woodbine is one of the glories of high summer. The late Dutch Honeysuckle, Serotina is one of the best cultivated varieties, it flowers from July to mid-autumn, red on the outside and nearly white within, its fully hardy and not fussy about conditions and has a gorgeous scent: a valuable deciduous climber to locate wherever you walk or sit in your garden, so that you can fully avail of its magnificent scent to bees, some plants are like fine wines and this climber is definitely one of these!

### TIPS

- 1. When Lavenders go out of flower, clip over lightly in order to retain its neat shape.
- 2. Pansies and Violas can be cut back hard in order to encourage new growth.
- 3. Why not collect seeds from your favourite flowers; many kinds germinate best when sown fresh at this time of year.
- 4. A good way to encourage children into the garden is to build them a den and give them


Thank you to Harold Boys School for hosting the event, and particular thanks to all the parents for their support and who made this possible.



waiting staff it seems like it is just a big family working together.

The estates vineyard team are constantly experimenting with new grape varietals and are pushing forward with Merlot plantings with which they are producing 100% merlot wines, so far the wine is proving to be very successful. The region is a stickler for Cabernet Sauvignon and merlot mixes so once again with Voyager you can find something different and exciting within this region.

About thirty years ago a lot of winemakers in Margaret River came together and agreed that their Shiraz grape was not producing to the highest standard and perhaps never would. They destroyed their vines and replanted Cabernet/Merlot instead, which I believe was a good idea. Voyager however, be it due to boldness or a cunning plan for the very distant future, decided to keep their vines and are still producing a Shiraz. It is medium bodied with red berried fruits but the fruit is lost almost immediately and your palate is overrun by spice. It is not cheap to buy either, coming in at roughly  $\in$  35 per bottle. I think the Shiraz producing should be left to the South Australians who I feel can't be rivalled. All is not lost however, as they do produce a wonderful white wine, Chenin Blanc.

Chenin Blanc can be found all over the Margaret River region and Voyager do it well. It is a beautiful easy drinking wine that is full of tropical fruit flavours which gives this wine excellent character. It pairs perfectly with Asian cuisine or fresh seafood. This wine is more reasonably priced coming in at under  $\in 20$ . # Oh! How Television (and Radio) has changed over the years ....

I collected a very interesting unit from my suppliers some weeks ago. This unit (which I am testing at the moment) is connected to a satellite dish, and then connected to a typical wireless router, it then sends satellite channels to any portable "Wi-Fi" device within range (lap top, IPhone, Smart phone etc...). The system can support four different "Wi-Fi" devices at any one time, with the ability to record TV, pause live TV, and schedule recordings. There is an "app" which needs to be downloaded (at a cost of  $\in 1$ ), and there are variations available for almost any type of "Wi-Fi" device. Test results in next month's issue, and should they prove positive we will be providing this system as an alternative way to watching satellite television.
