A VISIT TO CHINA



Arriving in Beijing, picking up our suitcases at Arrivals, we were faced with twenty entry points with huge notices, 'Foreigners'; as I queried I felt not very welcoming?? Our first tour started at Tian An Men Square. I knew some of its history; as I stood there I felt the

moving atmosphere verv emotional. The amount of people! Thousands of them, mostly men; a feeling of loneliness at noticing so many families with one child only. This kept cropping up so I asked Denis, our Guide. He gave a harrowing story of his young life. His mother explained to him that her first pregnancy was female; he had a sister but she had been aborted. Then he was born: - the only one? All contradictions continually appearing, We are told One Child per Family and then we meet families with two or three

children, and we ask again to be told that they pay a fine of \$8000 or their Social Welfare is taken from them. I suppose a few tries at IVF would cost this in our country. Every morning as we left our hotel we encountered a meeting of traffic and people: 14 million in Beijing and 11¹/2 million in Xian, with 13.4 million in Shanghai. To travel to Xian and Shanghai we flew. All sorts of people. Some very rich people in huge cars, as well as medium and small cars, bicycles and scooters, buses with 'Packers' employed to push people onto the buses! Some bicycles with a small cart with huge black bags on the back, often a wife and child on top of his head: - nobody wearing a helmet. I was so amazed at how beautiful the people were. A young generation all working with very few having English as a language even at the Reception in the hotels. Maybe one person

would have a little English but, of course, I didn't have Chinese. We stayed in five star hotels and they were excellent. On day four we awoke to a snow storm but battled on to the Great Wall. I walked through deep snow but as I got to the Wall I decided it was too dangerous and went back to the café. I was disappointed I wouldn't get my Great Wall Medal. Within minutes half of the tour crept back to the café. There was a report later that a Japanese tourist had died that morning on the Wall. We then went to a jade factory with was great. We had a visit to the town and some of us bought jewellery and other jade souvenirs. We had coffee and used the European toilets which was a relief to all of us!

Our guide always managed to get one clean toilet for us otherwise we had to squat and the smell in those 'toilets' was gross. There never was toilet paper but we all brought lots of tissues. We went to many temples which were situated in lovely gardens with lots of plants still blooming. The weather was mostly warm and sunny. We had a rickshaw tour through private lanes similar to Pembroke Lane, Dublin, and visited a private house and then to a Lama Temple. This was one of my favourites. In 1694 this monastery was founded by Tibetan Buddhists. The locals put food on the altar and visitors brought kindle, lit it for incense. They pray to the figure of the Buddha bowing, kneeling and adoring. You could feel the spirituality of these people.

We saw the Panda Bears in Beijing Zoo. We then flew to Xian to visit the Terra Cotta Warriors and Horses. They were exhibited in the RDS many years ago. Architecturally, a masterpiece but, as I heard the story of the Emperor killing all those warriors so he would not be on his own when he died, I identified this megalomaniac with Hitler!

Day 9 was a day of leisure. We were offered a day at a farm, a Health Clinic and a school. We were thrilled. The farm was franchised and on a government grant. Two of our guides were

members of the Communist Party. Denis's grandfather and father were also members. We wore overshoes and were shown 300 head of black and white cows and about fifty calves which took great delight in me calling them to 'suck, suck'! They came to me as I put my fingers into their mouths. They and I loved it. The farm had no greenery; there was dust everywhere - even the trees were covered. The farmer's wife cooked lunch for us. It was wonderfully simple Chinese food.

I was delighted when we went to the clinic and met the doctor who had worked for thirty years without a holiday. I told them that I was born in 1933 and that our own local doctor never had a break. He was a lovely gentle man. He had three patients of approximately 2-3 years of age on drips, just in the hallway. In another room he had two adults also on drips. Then we went to the school where approximately thirty children - mostly boys - sang for us and then asked us to sing. I led with 'Beidh Aonach Amárach in gContae an Chlár' and our group joined in. We also danced a reel and an Irish jig. After that we went to the Art Class and had a lesson in Calligraphy.

The Forbidden City is surrounded by a ten metre high wall and it has, historically and artistically, the most comprehensive museums of two dynasties, Ming and Quing and their treasures. The Summer Palace is another monument to classical architecture and the Temple of Heaven is also part of the Ming Dynasty. We flew to Shanghai and took the world's fastest train ('The Maglev') from the airport to the city centre, at a speed of one hundred and fifty kilometres per hour. It was amazing. Then the lift to the Oriental Pearl TV Tower and then to our hotel. We discussed Chinese weddings. Often, there would be more than four hundred guests at a Chinese restaurant provided by the bride and groom.

Washing

The last day was Sunday which is wash day. All clothes were hung outside their apartments or on the sidewalk. They call it their National Flag!

When I look back on the twelve days, I never heard a four-letter word. Only the odd 'Jesus' and 'Oh, My God!' when our bus nearly crashed, was allowed!!

The very mild weather at the turn of the year brought the usual unseasonable records. I usually see the first year's leaves on a Horse Chestnut in early March but in the second week in January there were new leaves on Sycamore trees on Killiney Hill and new leaves on Alder trees in Booterstown. A male Dunnock was singing from the top of a gorse bush on Dalkev in mid January months before he'd normally be expected to and any mild mornings were full of the lovely song of Song Thrushes sounding through the darkness. Love seemed to be in the air for foxes, hearing a male barking below the Vico Road and a little later hearing the same sound in my own garden where later a pair of foxes were observed nonchalantly trotting across the lawn together. Evidently his barking had done the job and won him the heart of a female.

There are now lots of electronic forums that report sightings of rare and uncommon birds. nationwide or specifically for the East Coast such as www.irishbirding.com and East Coast Bird News twitter account. Most of the sightings are reported within an hour (sometimes minutes) or two of being seen with description and location details and if the sightings are of unique enough birds they will set off a little stampede of birders. I rarely ever check out any of the reports finding them more of a source of frustration or regret since I rarely have the time to go and check them out and there's always the underlining thought that I might go on a long journey, get there and not see the bird. I still recall the sense of disappointment I had years ago walking down the track to Broad Lough in Wicklow and meeting a group of birders who had just spent a happy few hours watching an Osprey fishing in the lake until it took to the wing to continue its migration north, about 40 minutes before I arrived on the scene.

But in December when I heard there had been regular recent sightings of a flock of waxwings that was a different matter. Waxwings are spectacular, easily identifiable and there was a flock of them. But the best thing about the sighting was they'd been seen at various locations along Avondale Road in Killiney. Next day I drove the length of Avondale Road on my way home at lunchtime. It was a cold but very sunny day, visibility was

perfect. I got to the Barnhill Road end but no sign of any unusual birds. I thought I'd try another look so back around the roundabout and up Avondale Road again. A small tree stood beside the footpath at the crest of the incline, its bare branches backlit by the low midday sun and on top of it was a flock of birds which. although only visible in silhouette, were unmistakably the waxwings. With their tall plume like crest, black eye mask, yellow tips to feathers and tail they look very exotic. You could imagine them in tropical forests but they are northern European birds

breeding in coniferous forests near the Arctic circle. A poor berry crop at home sometimes drives them south in what is known as a 'irruption' and this winter brought them to the UK and Ireland in record numbers.

Delighted I'd found them so easily I parked around the corner and got the telescope out to have a good look. I counted them, at least 70 and they stayed there till someone in an adjoining garden came out and disturbed them.

Returning after lunch they were at the other end of the road strung along a telegraph line till a very perturbed Mistle Thrush, although greatly outnumbered, defended his berry patch by launching a attack on them which sent them packing.

Waxwings get their name from the red wingtips which, when their wing is folded, resembles a blob of the red wax which used to be dripped hot on to envelopes of important documents to seal them. Their Latin generic name is *Bombycilla garrulus*, which derives from *Bombyx* meaning silk and *cilla* meaning 'tail' which refers to their silky-soft plumage while garrulous meaning talkative refers to their constant chattering. A charming name for a charming little bird.

In November we eventually got to see the Great Spotted Woodpecker that had been reported on Killiney Hill and the Friday before Christmas we got to see three separate pairs of the released red squirrels, at one stage causing a minor human traffic jam on the path above the Vico as my companion Lucy showed people the red she had spotted perched on the very top of a Larch tree. As far as I know the woodpecker hasn't been seen recently on Killiney Hill but became a regular visitor to a feeder in a garden at the back of Mullins Hill. For a while the squirrels were very obliging, coming down to feeders and being seen reasonably easily. On one occasion I quietly approached one of the feeding stations and

was rewarded with a charming sight. A squirrel had gone into a open fronted box and was looking out, at one stage with its tiny paws resting on the opening as if it was a little shopkeeper. If it had been wearing a bonnet and a pinafore it would have passed as a character out of a Beatrix Potter story.

By the time of publication the researchers will have trapped the squirrels and removed their radio collars before re releasing them, hoping some of them might pair up and start a family. It was good to see our original remaining red was still around, distinguished by her lack of a collar. It'll be much more difficult to recognise her when the others lose their collars although the imported Wexford reds have a much browner tinge while our survivor has a much more consistently red tinge to her fur.

When the squirrels are re-released the researchers will become much more reliant on sightings by the public. Lots of up to date information on the Killiney Hill Red Squirrel Group page on Facebook.



Dalkey Island Oil 'Prospect' - Well, what a year it's been! ... since that packed-out meeting in Dalkey Town Hall last January and all the subsequent debates and demonstrations at east-coast venues and outside the Dáil. As for now, An Taisce's High Court judicial review hearing, disputing the decision for exploratory drilling off Dalkey Island, is set for 19 February.

An Taisce claim the Government's decision last September to grant a Foreshore Licence to Providence Resources (for oil and gas exploration), was unlawful and the licence should be quashed, as it failed to carry out an Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) required by EU Habitats Directive to protect cetaceans etc.

Also, An Taisce claim that this development is "a failure in the national legislative

framework, on which this decision was made, which has implications for drilling both offshore and onshore."

Another major move in the controversy came in December when Minister for Heritage Jimmy Deenihan announced a proposed NATURA 2000 site. Should the Special Area of Conservation (SAC) that stretches between Rockabill to Dalkey Island, overlap the licensed area, it could be 'extremely problematic', commented The Irish Times.

Providence Resources claim they had not been given advance information of the SAC, which could overlap their seismic and sonar survey area and they would respond following further assessment.

Coliemore Harbour Ferry: A licence for the commercial ferryboat service to Dalkey Island has been awarded at last and to local boatman, Ken Cunningham, who has served this 'traditional' ferry role for years.


However, the licence is restricted to just five passengers and only from Coliemore.

Furthermore, Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council (DLRCC) will not permit the ferry service from Coliemore on safety grounds, until the structural damage (let alone costs) are known when a consultant engineer's report is due this February. In the meantime, the Coliemore ferry restoration committee (see Nov. issue) with the support of Dalkey Community and involving 21 groups, continue to press councillors to ensure the harbour remains the historic embarkation point.

Dalkey Island Slipway Upgrade: The Coliemore committee are also to submit and respond to DLRCC, following a proposed PART 8 Scheme to upgrade the island's slipway (where a consultation process with plans on view, ended on 29 January). The public can still make written submissions to the council by 5pm, Tuesday 12 Feb. See:www.dlrcoco.ie/newsevents/latestnews/title,8929,en.html

Among proposed new works (up to 12 weeks to complete) is to raise the existing slipway and pier with steps and widening of the channel, which is to cost €228,000 approx. The project could see 500 helicopter flights over eight days, transferring machinery and materials from a 'desired site' near Sorrento Point (green at Dillon's Park?).

Dalkey Island Forum: organised by Dalkey Civic Trust (DCT) drew more than 40 delegates in November to St. Patrick's Church. where a panel of experts presented heritage topics on maritime archaeology, history and architectural features which proved both fascinating and

equally insightful. Also discussed was Coliemore ferry access and possible impacts of the PART 8 plans. Niall Brady, Edel Bhreathnach, Darina Tully and Jason Bolton were thanked for their excellent presentations.

Dunlaoghaire / Dublin Bay Cruises - As previously reported in this column, an alternative to Coliemore Harbour, for ferry embarkation to Dalkey Island, is Dun Laoghaire Harbour. Its cruise-tender dock pontoon is expected to be served by a new operator, providing cruises of Dublin Bay this season (see 'excursions' Oct. 2011) using a 150-passenger former Inisbofin island ferry.

MANAGE THE SYMPTOMS FOR LIFE OR HEAL THE CAUSES?

Many people believe that depression is not a disease of the brain but a dis-ease within the psyche, of the conscious and unconscious mind. In Ireland, the symptoms of depression (and anxiety) are treated within the medical model. A GP or a Psychiatrist will diagnose, medicate and monitor the symptoms to ensure that the patient can better cope in their daily lives. With severe depression this can make the difference between barely living and managing to function. What is little discussed in the Irish media is that depression can be healed. To treat the symptoms is vital but a sole response can mean a lifetime of medication (the pharmaceutical companies are delighted) to manage the symptoms. The other option, often in parallel with medication, is psychotherapy/counselling to gently explore the causes behind the symptoms. Many GPs and Psychiatrists now recommend this route to their patients alongside medication.

Depression can be healed but not simply. There are no quick fixes. Its underlying causes may root back to ungrieved losses, low selfesteem, early childhood trauma, repressed anger, abuse or other painful burdens. It can sometimes link to a severe inner critic. (common in perfectionists), that directs an unconscious stream of pummelling self-talk with origins in childhood or school. ('you're no good, you were never any good, vou're a failure, vou're unlovable'). The journey to heal is the road less travelled. The pilgrim needs courage and patience for this vovage of selfdiscovery but the rewards, the laying down of painful burdens that no longer need to be carried, can make it the trip of a lifetime.



This was a winery that I was hoping would be on the itinerary. One of the oldest and most famous in Margaret River. Not only is it a winery but it holds concerts in the grounds. Stevie Wonder and Michael Bublé performed here recently. Their wines are exceptional but their shiraz's were my favourite. We had lunch alfresco with a few surprises. Kangaroo and grubs made up part of the menu. Then it was back on the coach for our next destination. This time though we were on our way to a cocktail tasting. DALKEY ISLAND FERRY SERVICE UPDATE



FROM DALKEY CIVIC TRUST AND FLOR O'MAHONY

The following, for information, is an update from Mr. Flor O'Mahony who chairs the local ad hoc group that has been liaising with the Council in relation to restoration of the Dalkey Island ferry service and - linked with this - the proposed works on the Island and at Coliemore Harbour. A meeting of the group to decide on a joint approach to the Part 8 Planning process is expected to take place shortly and at that stage a further update will be circulated.

It is time for an update on our collective endeavours to ensure access for a managed, commercial ferry service to Dalkey Island from Coliemore Harbour.

You may recall that, following the County Council's Area Committee meeting on September 24th, we reported that the Council's management indicated that they intended to initiate a public consultation on the proposed Part 8 scheme to upgrade the access slipway on Dalkey Island. Separately, and following pressure from Councillors on Council management to clarify their concerns regarding the safety of the piers at Coliemore Harbour, the management agreed to commission a structural survey of the harbour. Both initiatives are underway at present.

The Public Consultation of the Proposed Part 8 Scheme to Upgrade the Slipway at Dalkey Island

The proposal consists of: -

*

"The upgrade to the existing Slipway at Dalkey Island to include: raising the existing slipway to create a stepped top surface, widening of the existing channel, a new raised pier section with transitional steps, a handrail, mooring rings and an access ladder."

The Notice of the proposed work is available in Dalkey Library; and in the Planning Department in County Hall, Marine Road between 10am-4pm, Monday to Friday, until January 29th. It is also on www.dlrcoco.ie/newsevents/latestnews/title,8929,en.html

We recommend that you read this detailed proposal, if you haven't done so. In addition to the proposal on upgrading of the island's slipway, it provides an insight into the wider plans the Council has for the future conservation and management of the island's very important natural, historical, archaeological and wildlife heritage. A high-level committee of experts is at present working on proposals to give effect to the island's status as a Special Protection Area (SPA) and a Special Area of Conservation (SCA). It is expected that the Committee will bring forward a Conservation and Management Plan for the island in February.

While the public consultation process refers to the up-grading of the island slipway only, it does provide us with an opportunity to once again strongly assert the essential historical connection between the island and mainland Dalkey, via Coliemore Harbour. We hope that all of the 21 groups which signed our previous letter to the Council will once again be prepared to support a response to the present consultation which, while welcoming the upgrading of the island slipway, demands that a small, licensed, managed, commercial ferry service be permitted between Coliemore Harbour and the island.

Responses to the Part 8 consultation must be submitted by 5pm on Tuesday, February 12th. We look forward to discussing how best to respond at our forthcoming meeting.

structural safety issues at Coliemore Harbour, management agreed to have a survey of the harbour carried out. Malachy Walsh & Partners were appointed to conduct the survey in early December and are expected to produce their report around the end of February next. Conclusion.

We hope you will be free to attend the forthcoming meeting. Together we have made progress towards achieving our joint objective to ensure that a well-managed, licensed, commercial ferry service is permitted to operate between Coliemore and the island. Major decisions will be taken by the Council in the coming months in relation to both the conservation and management of the island's heritage and the means of access to it. We need to ensure that our views continue to be heard and listened to as these decisions are made.


