#### Dalkey Islands' Conservation Plan 2014-2024:

The Conservation Plan was launched by An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Carrie Smyth on June 3rd at Dalkey Castle & Heritage Centre. Copies of the plan are available in the Library and can be viewed on-line at the council's website www.dlrcoco.ie/heritage.

In terms of understanding the site(s), the plan covers areas of Natural, Geological, Archaeological and Built Heritage. It further deals with Vulnerabilities under all of the above headings. Finally, it outlines the Policies and Management Actions.

After many years of advocacy, we are delighted that this wonderful site has been legitimised. It plays an important part in the psyche of all Dalkey people everywhere. Dalkey Castle will work with the newly-licensed small ferry service. Visitors to the Island can be oriented at the Heritage Centre before or after the ferry trip to the island. It is of the utmost importance that accurate information is disseminated and that visitors to the island observe a code of conduct compatible with the objectives and policies of the conservation plan.

#### A Summer of Heritage.

A free guided tour of Dalkey Castle & Heritage Centre will be part of the DLR Summer of Heritage programme beginning on Thursday July 4th. The free tours for locals will be on each Monday and Thursday at 10.40am. This time is set aside for this bespoke tour, funded by DLRCoCo.

The tour will last at least one hour and will include an overview of all the new interpretation systems with its extensive bank of historical information. The guides will lead visitors around the Early Christian Church & Graveyard, upstairs into the fortified Town House and onto the battlements. From there, they will get magnificent views of the surrounding area right over to Howth. Back inside, you will be given a taster of the life and times of the writers included in the Writers' Gallery.

As part of the tour visitors will get to experience the living history live performance that has grown in popularity year on year. Guests will meet and have fun with characters from Dalkey's Tudor past. Numbers will be limited on each tour, so book early to avoid disappointment. After the tour, visitors can browse for more information at their leisure.



Many people's earliest memories of gardens are of Enid Blyton: lazy days, blowing raspberries on blades of grass, heat haze on tarmac roads, fat bees, squished sandwiches in tree houses and the feeling that summer will never, ever end.

Go on, get out there, whether into your own garden, a friend's, your granddaughter's, your not-so-favourite neighbours, even your local park. No matter how busy or preoccupied you might feel, there are few more inspiring sights than buds about to burst open as well as the beauty of flowers, shrubs and trees. Trees, in particular, no matter how old or straggly and gangly they're looking, are simply amazing; aren't they intriguing and some, even hundreds of years old, continue to look flawless. So make sure this July, you kick your shoes off, sit down and enjoy the fruits of your labours: find some secluded spot, a little bench or seat whatever, even a tree stump, will do. No need for sophistication or expense, just take time and enjoy!

July sees a lot of plans and preparations made earlier in the year come to fruition and lots of fruits and vegetables and herbs, reach picking size in the coming weeks. Others are still being sown and planted and there is quite a way to go, yet in the season. It is vital, to keep on top of things this month especially weed control and then of course, picking produce at the right time. So generally speaking, our Dalkey gardens are at their peak, they are brimming with bright energy; Colour is on a grand scale this month: it is our month of flower-filled borders, Roses, Lilies, Phlox, Campanulas, Astroemerias, Day Lilies, Penstemons, Kniphofias, Thalictrums, Astrantias, Buddlejas, Hydrangeas, Honeysuckles, Bearded Irises, Canterbury Bells, Gladioli, Hollyhocks and Delphiniums, etc. abounding. Why not, now and again, take your snack or meal out into your garden or even your naughty weekend 'midnight' supper. Doesn't it taste so delicious - no matter what it is? Isn't it such a different taste than that inside? So, should we all not be relishing in This Hour.

#### **LOOKING GOOD - RIGHT NOW**

- 1. Meadow Rue, Thalictrums: They are tall perennials, light, airy sprays of tiny rich lilac coloured flowers. We have Hewitts Double and it is an absolutely stunning plant.
- 2. Epic Epimediums: Thanks to the recent introduction of new exciting species, Epimediums are at last getting all the attention they deserve. Epimediums tick all the boxes for my ideal plant. This family of perennials all have elegant foliage and exquisitely shaped flowers. Cutting back the old foliage right to the ground in early spring will mean that the flowers and pristine new foliage can be seen to perfection, but I prefer generally to leave on the foliage of the more evergreen types as they afford some protection against a late frost, which could frazzle the soft new shoots.
- 3. For sheer full-on-flower-power, some say, nothing can touch a rambler in full swing. Rambling Roses

have a different growth habit to climbers. They flower on the previous years shoots while climbers flower on the current year's growth.

#### MIGHT DO / MAYBE MAY JOBS

- 1. A greenhouse is a great asset when it comes to plant propagation, because rooting of cuttings is much more successful due to extra warmth. The vast majority of deciduous garden shrubs can be propagated easily by taking semi-hardwood cuttings now.
- 2. All kinds of cacti and greenhouse succulents can be regularly watered and occasionally give a liquid feed this month.
- 3. It really does pay off to make the time to potter about this month, tidying bedding, pulling up weeds and giving a welcome drink to pots and plants in need. You can move your post around, bringing your best displays to the foreground.
- 4. Maybe, clip deciduous hedges this month as much of the years growth is complete and the wood is still relatively soft and easy to clip.
- 5. When your first flush of Roses fade, cut back their stems to a strong bud lower down and then, give your treasures a feed.
- 6. Basil is a member of the Mint family and is a fast grower in the heat of a greenhouse in summer. I recently bought a Lemon Basil plant and a Pineapple Basil plant. Both are doing well. Remember to keep pinching their flowers out in order to help the plant make new leaves.

**Summertime Blues** – Blue is a cooling colour and is wonderfully atmospheric in our summer gardens because smoky, misty blues are soft and gentle and actually create an illusion of distance. Have you ever noticed, red seems to creep, into the foreground?

#### REVIVED FERRY SERVICE TO DALKEY ISLAND

#### A NEW BOAT SERVICE TO DALKEY ISLAND HAS BEEN LAUNCHED

We are very pleased to confirm that a new passenger boat service from Coliemore Harbour to Dalkey Island has begun. It will be provided by local boatman Ken Cunningham, who has received a licence from the Dept. of the Marine. with the agreement of Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council, to provide the service. The boat has been built to the specifications set down by the Department for licensed passenger boats of its size.

As local people know, Dalkey Island is a special place to visit and enjoy during summer months. In addition to the pleasure of taking a boat ride and enjoying the panoramic views from the boat and from the island, it has the added interest associated with its designation as a Special Protection Area (SPA) to maintain or restore the favourable conservation condition of the island's bird species, in particular three species of terns. The area between Rockabill and Dalkey islands is also designated a proposed Special Area of Conservation (SAC) because it is a key habitat for harbour porpoise within the Irish Sea. In addition the island has been designated a zone of Archaeological Potential by the National Monuments Service. The church is a National Monument managed by the Office of Public Works, while the Martello Tower and the gun battery are protected under the planning acts. Whether people wish to visit the island to relax and enjoy its natural environment or to connect with its important physical, natural and archaeological heritage we are very pleased that the return of a boat service will make the trip possible for locals and visitors alike. We also note with pleasure that the service will provide an opportunity for the growing numbers of visitors to Dalkey's Heritage Centre to visit the island as part of their exploration of the area's rich heritage.

We would like to thank Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council's members and officials for agreeing to carry out the necessary repairs and safety enhancements to the piers in Coliemore Harbour and on the island. The Council has taken over responsibility for the management and maintenance of the Harbour in consultation with harbour users. We understand that existing boat owners who wish to continue to moor their boats in the harbour will be asked to pay a modest permit fee. Boat owners who wish to access the sea through Coliemore and leave again within the day will not be subject to a fee.

Finally, we would like to thank the 25 local community, sports, business, credit union, churches, schools and other social groups for their immediate and unstinting support towards the present very welcome result.

On June 3rd. following an invitation from HM Oueen Elizabeth II, Dalkev residents Eamon and Mary O'Leary attended a royal garden party at Buckingham Palace. Eamon, a Second Coxswain on the RNLI Dun Laoghaire Lifeboat was asked to represent the

thousands of RNLI operational, support and fundraising volunteers in Ireland. Last year in Ireland the RNLI launched 1,087 times to bring 1,278 people to safety. Dun Laoghaire RNLI's all-weather and inshore lifeboats had the most launches in 2013, with its crew rescuing 67 people during 58 call outs.

Often these local launches are Call-Outs to people classed as 'ashore'. These services included assisting people who were ill or injured on an island, cliff or the shoreline, where access by lifeboat was the fastest or safest way to reach the casualty.



Many of our local lifeboat crew are Dalkey people and this has been the case over many years. The RNLI depends on the support and generosity of the community to carry out its vital work.



THE
SARAH
IN
BULLOCH
HARBOUR

**JENNY DILLEY** in her interesting article in the 40th Anniversary Edition of the Dalkey Newsletter on Dalkey Rowing Club referred to an old rowing boat called 'Sarah', which was part of the story of the foundation of the Rowing Club in 1934.

Readers may be interested to see this photograph of the 'Sarah' in Bulloch Harbour, with the 'Malachy' in the background, taken by Kit O'Rourke towards the end of the War-probably 1944. Pat Kavanagh is in the bow, John Joe Byrne of Carysfort Road, Patrol Leader of the 3rd Port of Dublin Sea Scouts, is in the stern.

The 'Sarah' had been owned for years - decades probably - by 'Bowlyam' Murray at Coliemore Harbour and the Sea Scouts bought it from him. Kit O'Rourke and John Joe Byrne in turn bought it from the Scouts for £10. It was in bad condition then, lying outside the Scouts' Hut in Sandycove Avenue East.

Kit and John Joe loaded it on a trolley, borrowed from Leo Treston, and with the help of a big crowd of helpers, wheeled the very heavy skiff along the tramlines to Bulloch, into Dalkey, up Dalkey Avenue and Ardbrugh Road and, finally, into the Quarry. It was then pushed over the back wall of Kit's home in Ardbrugh Villas. There, with the help of a contraption made from an old drainpipe part-filled with water and heated with a wood fire, they steamed and shaped new ribs for the boat. Repaired, seams filled with putty and red lead and painted, the skiff was wheeled back down the hill to Bulloch where Kit and John Joe kept it for two or three years, during which period this photograph was taken.

Later, it was bought by the Knights of the Silver Hook.

Work is ongoing tackling weeds which spring up through every crack. The only people who tackle the weeds are the Tidy Towns volunteers and there are a lot of footpaths in Dalkey. Bulloch Harbour is another target area for weed removal.

Painting peeling planters and walls are all part of the general sprucing up of the town. Volunteers are always welcome: Every Tuesday and Saturday outside Select Stores and every Thursday at Dillon's Park. Meet at 10.30 a.m.





Murdering Point Winery

Travelling up along the Bruce highway through North Queensland is filled with beautiful scenery. Sugar cane plantations, tropical hills and a vast amount of fruit trees populate this vast area. With this abundance of fruit I was surprised to find only one winery in 600 km. Now, Australians have many weird and wonderful names for their wineries such as '5th leg' and 'Pure Evil' but 'Murdering Point' is not one that screams 'come visit'. However curiosity got the better of us and we turned around and made our way up to the Cellar Door. The aptly named Berryman family, who established this winery in 2001, seem to be one of few people who are taking advantage of the states produce and making tropical fruit wines and they are doing it well. Their Cellar door is not much to look at but inside it is a warm and friendly environment. I was met by Mellissa Berryman, the second generation of the clan. The very first thing I had to ask was about the wineries name. True to form, murder was involved! In 1878 in the gold rush days of Northern Australia a number of sailing ships foolishly tried to land on the shores close to where the winery now stands. Unfortunately for them the aboriginals were not happy to see them and had them for dinner instead of having dinner with them. The wines that Murdering Point produce is vast, lychee, passionfruit, mulberry to name but a few, the list goes on. They also have a range of cream liqueurs in chocolate mint and coffee. The first one I tried was my favourite-Lychee which is a fruit that you may have tried before at your local Chinese for desert, this is the first time I have tried Australian lychee never mind a lychee wine and I have to give it a 10/10. The other flavours were nearly as good. The cream liquors were average but I reckon Baileys still holds the best score in that regard. You can only purchase the Berryman Family wines at cellar door Queensland. However, I believe it is only a matter of time before they hit Irish shores.






