HC: Congratulations to Dalkey Castle who for the third year has been awarded the Award of Excellence 2017 from CIE Tours. The Manager Margaret Dunne is commended on her continued work and commitment to promote the town of Dalkey.

TT: DTT has completed the paving path to the old well in Dillon's Park. The "Seven Castles" project is proceeding and there are plans to upgrade the planter boxes at SuperValu, Writer's Corner and to attend to the paving at the rear of Our Lady's Hall. DTT will hold a Recycling Workshop in the HC on Tuesday 13th March. (See page 24)

NW: Garda Ailbhe gave us a report on crime trends for the Dalkey area that reflects a downturn in crime on the same period last year. She had leaflets on the Senior Alert Scheme that is a very good security system for the elderly. Ailbhe also alerted us to the scam text messages that are being sent and under no circumstances should these messages be opened – if any are received delete immediately. Ailbhe is willing to visit any resident who has mobility difficulties and is unable to come to the twice monthly Garda Clinics held in OLH. If requests are called into Dun Laoghaire Garda Station (666 5000) she will follow up on them.

Planning: There were 269 observations made for the latest planning application for Bulloch Harbour and a decision is awaited on it.

AOB: Alan Winter is carrying out feasibility studies for the positioning of towers for the lifts at Dalkey DART Station. The online petition can be still be accessed (www.petitions.ie/view-petitions/ireland/liftdalkeydart) and it is proposed to approach the relevant bodies when a plan has been finally drawn up.



DALKEY RELATIVES 1940 SEARCH URGENTLY NEEDS OUR HELP



Last month, we started a fascinating search which has yet to yield results. Briefly, we are looking for any information on relatives of eleven Corporals and Volunteers who manned the vital World War II Lookout Post No.7 which was positioned on the summit of our Sorrento Park. Their job, as part of the Coast Watching Service, was to log all movements of aircraft, day and night, at a time when Ireland and Dublin in particular could be bombed with very serious loss of life. Inspired by Michael Kennedy's fascinating book "*Guarding Neutral Ireland*" we issued a special request for your help. The children of some of the eleven individuals might still be in their 70's. There may even be a photo or memento out there which would be wonderful to see again. With the hope of having a special Information Panel erected in their honour, we need more details. 
Author and broadcaster Michael Kennedy has found another priceless photo which we have confirmed as taken on the summit of Sorrento Park in World War II. Look closely and you will clearly see Lamb Island beside Dalkey Island in the background. We have checked this with photos taken just last week. One of the two individuals shown can be seen wearing spurs which may indicate a Cavalry Corps and Armoured Car background. Another knowledgeable Newsletter reader, James Scannell, has also thrown light on the rotations and movement of the individuals in our search which really helps to bring it to life. 



want. These sessions will take place on March 2nd and 23rd from 10.15 to 11.15am





Dear Mrs O'Kane,

The members of the Board of Commissioners of Dun Leary Harbour beg to inform you that it has to communicate unfortunate tidings to you. It has felt advised to direct this through the good offices of Miss Edgeworth who is, we are given to understand, acquainted with you. It is with profound regret that we have to advise you of the death of your son, Thomas O'Kane. This resulted from an unfortunate accident which occurred on 3rd inst. when some large slabs of rock were dislodged unexpectedly from the cliff face at Dalkey, falling precipitously and with little warning on the base at which he was employed, injuring him fatally.

Exercising goodwill, the Board of Commissioners arranged for the interment of your son in the cemetery at Kill O' The Grange in County Dublin, although he was not in the direct employ of the Board but of a contractor. This cemetery can be visited during all seven days of the week. In their charity the Commissioners herewith forward the sum of nine pounds and two shillings which corresponds to the remuneration that would have been disbursed by the Board in the case of your son, had he survived a further quarter in the employ of the Board's contractor

Easter 1972

As Easter was approaching I thought it be a nice idea, now that Kieran was 3 years of age, if we could arrange an Easter egg hunt. Not having a garden, it had to be done somewhere outside, the lovely park near us seemed to be ideal for that. All we needed was children, eggs and an Easter bunny. We asked friends and neighbours with children to join us, decorate eggs with them and bring these to our house the

day before Easter Sunday. We got a great gathering of people and a good pile of eggs. Nel, the mother of Kieran's best friend Peter, offered to help me with the hiding of the eggs. All that was needed now was an Easter Bunny suit, which I made for myself.

Off we went early on the day with the eggs, suit and face paints. The park was lovely and quiet, not a soul to be seen. We picked a bushy area right in the middle of the park. Once all the eggs were hidden I started to put on my suit and then in the middle of painting my face Nel bursted out in hilarious laughter. She thought it the funniest thing and decided there and then that she had to take a photo. She insisted on going home and getting her camera. No matter what I said I couldn't keep her there. I had a role planned for her. "Please Nel, you have to meet the crowd at the gate at 10 am and lead them to this place!" "You won't have enough time!" Nel insisted that the 20-min. left was enough time and off she went.

Here I was on my own in this big park, dressed up as a bunny sitting in the bushes and to my horror without a watch. How does one guess time? My experience of cooking a boiled egg without looking at the clock, doesn't work. And that is only waiting for 3 minutes. Even waiting for 1 minute is a challenge. We used to have to be silent for one minute on the 4th of May to remember the victims of World War II. All the church bells in the whole of the Netherlands would chime and when they stopped, no matter where you were you had to stay silent for one minute. It always seemed ages. How was I going to guess 20 minutes? Knowing Nel I knew she wouldn't make it in time. I was getting more and more anxious. I could just imagine everybody gathering and not knowing what to do. Frank be there too with Kieran and Mona in the buggy. Everybody possibly asking him what to do.


Suddenly, when I was looking around I saw an elderly couple strolling on a path in my direction. Delighted I jumped out to ask them the time, forgetting about my attire. They nearly jumped out of their skins and the astonishment on their faces, even now writing this, still makes me laugh.

I had hoped that Nel would have welcomed the group and walked with them in the direction of the hiding place. As soon as they could spot me I would have hopped around the field before disappearing in another bush to undress. I wanted to keep the magic alive. I now had no choice. It was time to face the group on my own. I could see them from a distance and started hopping in their direction, but as soon as they could see me they ran so fast that my hopping had not enough speed to cope with that. First, I started to run and then decided it was a losing battle, so I just put up with the loss of magic and welcomed the children into the hiding place, which was fun interacting with the children as an Easter Bunny. It was lovely to see the excitement when the children found the eggs. It was well worth being part of it. Also the parents enjoyed themselves. Funnily enough some feedback later from the parents was that when they were in the park with their children, they were still looking for the bunny and the eggs a good while after that.

I can't include a photo here. Although Nel was part of the crowd, she must not have been able to find her camera in time!

Because it went so well, that from then on, we always had an Easter hunt until Kieran and Mona outgrew it and continued again when the grandchildren came along. For years we celebrated it in the mountains of Kippure Estate, where we hired one of their chalets for Easter week. Now the adults take it in turn to dress up and when the children spot the bunny on top of the mountain, which they can see from the window with binoculars, they know to start the hunt, which now includes chocolate eggs!

Q. My 4 year old has been complaining of feeling very tired and having an itchy bum especially at night time. I noticed a little white threadlike worm in her stools yesterday. Could this be related and how would I treat it?

A. Threadworms are a common childhood infection of the large intestine and are most often found in children under ten. The worms are white and look like a piece of thread and may be visible in a child's bottom or in their

poo. They may not have any symptoms but often the main symptom is itching in the bottom or vagina especially at night. This may result in disturbed sleep.

A severe infection can cause symptoms of loss of appetite, weight loss, insomnia and bedwetting.

The worms lay their eggs at night and if scratched the eggs can lie under the fingernails and get re ingested which starts a new infection cycle. They can survive on surfaces for up to two weeks so it is important if an infection is discovered that all surfaces and bed linen, pyjamas etc. are disinfected.

Treatment is very straightforward and does not require a visit to the GP. Your Pharmacist can advise on the products and hygiene procedures needed to successfully treat the infection. A GP visit is only needed if you are pregnant or the child is under the age of 2.

Mebendazole is the medication used to treat threadworm and is available over the counter without prescription. The standard treatment is one dose initially followed by a second dose two weeks later. Everyone in the family should be treated at the same time.

The hygiene measures are important to ensure reinfection does not occur and should be followed for up to six weeks after treatment.

They are as follows:

Wash all night clothes, bed linen, towels and soft toys at 60°C on diagnosis

Avoid shaking any items that may be contaminated as this will spread the eggs in the air. Vacuum and mop the whole house but especially the bedrooms and bathrooms

Wash hands frequently with warm soapy water especially under the nails particularly after going to the toilet

Keep fingernails short and discourage nail biting or finger sucking

Wear tight fitting underwear at night and change first thing in the morning washing them well

Do not share towels and shower/bath regularly

Children do not need to be kept out of school or crèche but they should be informed so the proper hygiene procedures can be followed.

Your Pharmacist should be able to provide all advice needed for the management of threadworms.

MARCH IN MY GARDEN by Philippa Thomas

March is truly, the first month of Spring and with longer days and rising temperatures, our gardens are coming alive. ...Having said 'This', March too, can be unpredictable. ... March is a busy time of the year in the greenhouse as it's time to sow many plants. Make sure, you have a good supply of 'Best Buy Compost' plus labels, trays and pots. Water your indoor plants more regularly, now that our weather is warmer. ...From your armchair, you can order your seeds and plug plants online. Give these plug plants a pinch, a couple of times while the plants are young. This will make them nice and bushy and they will have far more flowers. Honestly, there is so much available now, when it comes to growing your own. There are flowers of every possible description; their symmetry, their personality, how they reach for the sun, the light, - : their drama, romance, their hope - ...flowers

basically grow and adapt or they don't survive. They have, so to speak, a deep desire to stand in all their colourful glory, even in the most challenging environments. I might try growing some new potatoes shortly, in a large container. The taste of home grown, new potatoes in early June is irresistible and I believe the varieties Orla. Colleen or Setanta are so easy to grow, are blightresistant and packed full of flavour, have thin skinned balls of flour with that special 'New Potato' distinctive flavour.

The nestling period will be beginning about now, so it's best to avoid putting peanuts in your feeders as young nestlings can choke on them. Good foods to use in the Spring include black sunflower seeds, mealworms, wax worms, (wax worms are the caterpillar larvae of wax moths), soft apples and pears, bananas and grapes cut in half.

Did You Know?

Slugs Slugs have no external shell. They have evolved to have a reduced shell just under their skin. This means that they can easily travel underground and will hide there during daytime, they tend to hide in nooks and crannies and have been known to roost in shrubs and trees.

Snails. Snails require calcium to form their shells so most species are restricted to calcareous areas. Snails can become much more of a problem in limestone and chalky soils than in other areas. Slug and snail damage tends to peak in Spring and again in Autumn with a quieter period in the Summer when it is drier. ...Half a grapefruit filled with beer and left in the garden overnight will soon indicate your situation. ...Also, Slugs and snails do not like to cross copper. Snails and slugs have both male and female reproductive

organs, so only one individual is needed to start a new population. Some slug species can lay hundreds of eggs at once and can reproduce multiple times each year. ...But remember,

snails and slugs are part of the natural balance and work hard to break down decaying garden waste. They have a crucial role in the compost heap as many species eat only dead plant material and slugs and snails are also a food source for many creatures.

Also, Do You Know?

That children who garden generally eat more fruit and vegetables and, as a result, concentrate better in their various activities and at school.

MIGHT DO, MAYBE MARCH JOBS

Check for root-bound containers: It's worth checking over long term container plants to make sure their roots aren't coming out of their drainage holes. Re-pot into a container that is one size larger. If you don't want to put your plant in a larger put, then remove to a third of the existing root ball and re-pot into the same container.

Vine Weevil: The adult vine weevil makes distinctive notches in the edges of many plant leaves. This damage isn't much more than cosmetic. However, the white grubs underground can devastate plants by eating their roots. The best solution is to apply a biological control. This uses nematodes that attack the vine weevil.

Prune Roses: Remove all dead and crossing wood on your rose shrubs. Blackspot, powdery mildew and rust are often encountered on roses – roses can suffer from a range of diseases, best to use a fungicide formulation specifically designed for roses.

Hedges: often get neglected as they are sometimes the background of our displays but They Can Also Be Our Stars. In order to get strong healthy foliage it's well worth clearing the weeds within their bases, giving them a feed and then, mulching the bare soil.

The Chelsea Chop will extend the flowering period of late flowering perennials such as

sedum, *phlox* etc. and also makes the plants bushier.

Children – Consider giving yours a little patch of their very own, to grow whatever seeds they like, i.e. *Sunflower, Night-Scented Stock, Nasturtiums* and *Radishes* are superfast growers.

Plant out any forced flower buds in the garden such as Hyacinths and miniature *Daffodils* which have finished flowering indoors. Dead-head *Hydrangeas* before new growth appears.

It is worth giving your Watering Cans a good scrub to prevent fungal diseases.

NATURE CORNER

With their fiendishly difficult to extract roots, Dandelions have long been considered a serious enemy of gardeners but they are actually a very useful plant as a early provider of pollen for many bees, hoverflies and other insects since they flower so early in the year before most garden plants. The National Biodiversity Data Centre have an All-Ireland Pollinator Plan to help bees and other insects and on their website,

www.biodiversityireland.ie

they have a number of very worthwhile pdfs to download for specific groups or areas such as gardens, schools, farms, councils and tidy town organisations,

showing how they can create pollinator friendly environments. In the garden section the first of '5 Examples of Pollinator Friendly Actions for Gardens is'. Let the Dandelions Bloom! They provide vital food for pollinators, especially in early spring when little else is flowering in our gardens'.

Apparently, in a very encouraging development Dalkey Tidy Towns have approached the Parks Department with a view to making Sorrento Park a pollinator friendly park. A small compensation for Lucy being home sick with a very nasty flu was looking out the kitchen window and seeing two uncommon visitors to the bird feeders, a pair of jays. Her attention had initially been attracted by the finches and tits taking to the air, very unhappy with their interlopers and she saw one angry goldfinch actually pecking ineffectually at one of the jays as it skilfully hung upside down extracting sunflower seeds from the feeder. We eventually got down to Wicklow to have a look for the Glossy Ibis some of a number of these birds that had arrived in Ireland this winter. Some settled in Bunihinly bog in Co Westmeath and another at Lough Boora Discovery Park in Offaly but luckily for us three of them decided to come a lot closer and flew into Birdwatch Ireland's East Coast Reserve at Newcastle.

Two years ago Dick Coombes wrote an article in Birdwatch's Wings magazine speculating that glossy ibis might become a breeding species in Ireland following on Little Egrets which have gradually expanded their range north from Southern Europe and first nested in Ireland in 1997 with a dozen pairs simultaneously breeding in a Co. Waterford heronry and now commonplace around the country.

The Glossy Ibis are also birds of wetlands, resembling a curlew with long legs and down curving bill but larger and much darker. Although a gloomier theory is the birds are moving because their breeding areas are drying out glossy ibis have always been known as

adventurous birds, who have been expanding their territorial range for centuries (flying across the Atlantic Ocean to South America from where they've spread north) and it would be more positive to hope they were moving to expand their numbers. Some previous glossy ibis that arrived here had large coloured rings which could be read by telescope showing those particular birds came from Cota Donana in Spain. At the East Coast Reserve, a Little Grebe and a flock of Wigeon swam in front of the first hide on glistening smooth water. Some people arrived who told us a woodpecker had been seen earlier and was doing its display drumming on a tree on the other

side of the road from the reserve but no sign of the ibis until suddenly a pair flew past, right

We moved to another hide, couldn't see where they'd landed but saw three buzzards soaring in lazy spirals before one of them swooped low and suddenly the glossy ibis were in the air again. We moved back to the reserve entrance and from there we could see not two but three glossy ibis striding around jabbing their long bills into the soft ground and wandering in and out of a line of beech trees.

When passing Booterstown Marsh on the Dart you can often see groups of little egrets roosting on the raised mounds in the marsh at high tide and, who knows, in years to come they might be joined by glossy ibis.

LUCKY MR. JUDD

At the end of August 1915 it was announced that Mr. Raymond V. Judd, son of Mr. Michael. F. Judd, chairman of the Dalkey Urban District Council, had passed the Fellowship Examination of the Auctioneers' Institute, London, the only Irishman [at that time] to achieve this distinction by open examination. Employed by the Dublin estate agents Battersby & Co, he was recently admitted as a partner. He also survived the sinking of the *SS Arabic* on 19 August after it was torpedoed by the German submarine *U-24* off the Cork coast while en-route to New York, along with his sister Miss Ivy Judd and his brother, Dr. C.F. Judd, Medical Officer for Health, Stillorgan Division of the Rathdown Poor Law Union.

Royal Air Force Association (ROI) standard bearer, gives an account of his time in the Royal Air Force Regiment; 'Take a Step Back to the Royal Air Force 1939 – 1945' looks at the uniforms and kit of RAF Pilots and Aircrew from 1939 to 1945: Pat Dargan investigates the remarkable Fort Shannon built by the Irish Army to defend the Shannon Estuary during the Second World War in 'Ireland's Emergency Fortress – Fort Shannon': 'Meeting his fate Among the Cloud Above' tells the story of Joseph 'Joe' Kiernan who left his home in Mullingar in 1939 for a new career that would take him high above the clouds in Nazi Germany as revealed by Catherine Fleming who traces her uncle's wartime service; 'In Friendship and in Service – Supporting the RAF Family' focuses on the members of the Royal Air Force Association, Republic of Ireland, which looks after the welfare of veterans in the Republic of Ireland; The Spitfire is as an aviation legend. Part of the Ulster Aviation Society's collection is a replica of a Spitfire Mk2a that has a unique association with Northern Ireland which is the subject of 'The "Down" Spitfire Mk2a; In 'Emergency Over Irish Skies - The Irish Air Corps 1939 - 1946', AP (Tony) Kearns in the fifth part of this series, highlights the Irish Air Corps and its capabilities in the latter half of the Emergency years; 'Keeping Ireland's Aviation History Alive' looks at the collection of the Ulster Aviation Society which has 36 aircraft and other aviation artefacts in its museum at Maze Long Kesh, outside Lisburn, Co. Antrim and the education and restoration work carried out by the Society; Seán Feast in 'Coming Down in the Drink' recalls the story of a fighting Goldfish (Club) Flight Lieutenant John Brennan who died on April 20th 2017 and at that time was the last surviving wartime member of the Goldfish Club; The story of 'Michael O'Meara, V.C. -Irish/Australian V.C. of the First World War', who died from the effects of the wartime wounds in 1935, is revealed by Ian Loftus; in 'The Ivy Patch Gun' Kenneth L. 
Oh! How Television (and Radio) has changed over the years
