
DATES FOR THE DIARY:

Hello good people of Dalkey! Once again thank you for all your love and support and. most all. encouragement through What's App and texts. I am grateful for your thoughtfulness and the time you make for supporting Malawi Missions, the Poor Locations Feeding Programme, and me. Just felt I needed to send you the last update on Malawi before I fly out to Zambia and not sure what communication will be like depending on where I am there. So far, we have had success with the prison programs regardless of opposition challenges the details of which I won't go into here. It's absolutely shocking and disappointing to see so much corruption in my country and people suffering so much as a result of the

army.
Take, for instance.

police and

James whom I met last year. He had served many years in prison and when it came to his time to be released, a senior policeman would not release him until he had paid him a specific amount of money! In other words, he wanted a bribe and I refused to bow down to bribery even though we had the money to give him for James's release. It was the hardest thing for me not to do and I really struggled with it. To cut a long story short, as I write this, James has been released without us having to make that payment. There were lots of happy tears over James! On its own, this was a miracle considering the established culture within the authorities in Malawi. The poverty and horrific conditions that the prisoners exist in are simply beyond human comprehension. Such is the poverty amongst the prisoners that they burn the clothes we give them to use as fuel to cook their food. Sometimes I feel like I am watching a movie and I am going to wake only to realise I was dreaming. What I am witnessing is raw and real. One twentysomething boy stole my heart. Covered in sores on his face because of AIDS, no shoes on his feet, one dirty stinking t-shirt

and a torn pair of shorts to his name, he was a heartbreaking sight. No family or friend to go see him, loneliness, rejection and hunger seemed to be his constant - and only - companions.

At first I found it difficult to even look at him. Everything in me as a human being was being challenged left, right and centre in sheer disbelief as well as a feeling of helplessness combined with feelings of being overwhelmed by seeing a fellow human being enduring such suffering. We began a feeding program for this young man and started visiting him and taking food to him. At times, he would sell this food, including the slippers we bought for him, all for comfort money and some of the other prisoners were stealing his food. On one occasion I decided I would ask permission from the soldiers with whom I have been working if I could take the young man into an official's office and make sure this lad ate his food. We were granted permission and I have never seen a hungry man who couldn't wait to get his hands on the rice porridge we brought for him

together with some egg sandwiches as he quickly devoured all four of them. Then it was time for him to go back to the terrible conditions of the cells and seeing him being led back by the soldiers through the iron bars of the prison left me deeply moved because for the first time I felt such a wave of love in my heart for this boy and almost felt the loneliness he felt and I could see the great fear in him. Gone was the stench I smelt the first day I met him which was replaced by the excitement of seeing him again and the chance to feed him. He has since come through a lot and the sores on his face are better and he looks brighter and healthier. The sad thing is that he has no one at all to visit him, and such is the case with so many of them. The things we take for granted! The AIDS prisoners are being fed to the best of my ability and I am going to see them tomorrow to drop in some more food. Dave had been extremely underweight and I was very happy to be informed that he had gained a little weight all because of the peanut butter we had taken to him together with some other treats. The Women's Prison has been the most challenging for me as there I saw little one-month old babies with their mothers and two-year old little boys with no shoes. Even more difficult to comprehend was the fact that the women had no sanitary pads and they have to stand under a cold shower to 'bleed out' so to speak during menstruation. I was able to get lots of pads for them and I was shocked to see them clap their hands in excitement and appreciation when they saw the pads. I say this from the depth of my heart that I felt so overwhelmed and embarrassed at the same time and great disappointment towards the leaders of my country who appear to be failing their own. A precious friend, Caitríona Fogarty in Dalkey, has worked relentlessly with me to send more pads and underwear to the women and is in the midst of trying to negotiate with a Dublin company to donate pads to send out to the women even after I have left Africa. We have taken food and milk for the children and for the women. Going to drop a few clothes and shoes for the little boy. Good news is that two of the mothers have been released! Two more to go! The last Poor

Through the prisoners, I am learning that everybody deserves a second chance in life and somebody to believe in them even when society has given up on them. Nobody wants to go to prison. We can't change the world but we can extend our hands and reach out to somebody in need and it doesn't have to be far away. People need love and compassion and most of them are just outside our own doorsteps. We may not have the answers to everything in life, sometimes we may ask questions that we may never get answers to but one thing I sure am learning in the most challenging of ways is to reach out to those that we may not look twice at and not want to

be associated with. Like I said I am being humbled in every sense of the way and I have found this work to be of great reward. Lots of tears have been shed too over these precious people but all in all, they have brought and given me such joy in allowing me to be a little part of their lives for the duration of time I have been here. This I will cherish for the rest of my life. Once again thank you from my heart for your love and care. I look forward to seeing you all in May.

MALAWI FEEDING PROGRAMME BACKGROUND

All Poor Location Feeds in Malawi were done in the Blantyre region of Matope in Mpemba district. They are aimed at poor children where decent, nourishing food is a luxury in most areas of this locality. Pasta, meatballs, savoury rice and plain rice, beef meat lentils, dry fish and nsima (Maize flour cooked into a thick pulp, Malawi's staple food) were part and parcel of the menu for these feeds and they were highly appreciated by the people of this extremely poor area.

It was as if somebody had flicked a switch as the windy, wet, cold weather of Good Friday transformed overnight to Easter Saturday's beautiful blue skies, sunshine and rapidly rising temperatures and it kick-started all sorts of activity. I had taken my own advice and left out little clumps of dog hair on hedges and bushes in the garden as nest material and saw it being gathered by greenfinch and dunnocks. Round the hills it seemed as if birds were suddenly sprouting handlebar moustaches as they filled their bills with stems and grasses, a female linnet taking her nest building material into the gorse above the path. We were able to spot two separate pairs of mistle thrushes who had started bringing moss and twigs to

nests high in the forks of beech trees. I often wonder how they manage to breed successfully as they build highly visible nests on open limbs of trees and they seem to be in a constant state of battle with magpies and other potential predators. As we were watching one mistle thrush sitting in her nest a pair of jays appeared nearby. At first they were eating ivy berries then they too began gathering nesting material and flying off with it. We couldn't see where they went but it looks like they're not going to nest near last year's site where they had some, probably unwanted, close neighbours in a pair of sparrowhawks. We saw three butterflies that same warm morning, two peacocks and a small tortoiseshell which would have awoken from hibernation. Back in the garden I was able to witness ladybirds mating, long periods of total immobility broken by short bursts of activity when the, presumably, male on top would do little sideways wiggles.

We were very glad to hear from a friend we met on the hill that a number of red squirrels had taken up winter residence in a big garden off Killiney Hill Road, up to four individual females at one time, to the delight of the owner. Although we'd heard of sightings we ourselves hadn't seen any reds on the hill for a few months so were delighted to hear they were still in the vicinity. Just a few minutes after we met our friend as we headed up through the trees we were lucky enough to spot the subject of our conversation, first one, and then another red squirrel moving through some Scots pines. Looking up at them from below we were able to ascertain they were a male and a female,

hopefully a breeding pair. We watched them for ages, chewing moss or fungus off the bark of a tree trunk and holding little stems of larch between their paws as they nibbled the fresh young buds, looking as if they were playing some type of woodwind instrument. Seeing them at all, feeding or just perched, is always a pleasure but your heart soars when you see them moving, leaping effortlessly from tree to tree as these did, covering great distances in seconds. You can't help but be a bit concerned as they throw themselves from one slight branch to the next. Despite their agility and sharp claws squirrels do occasionally fall out of

trees and indeed we did once see one fall out of a tree though thankfully its descent was broken by other branches and it recovered quickly, seemingly unharmed, after hitting the ground.

You may have seen the very amusing video of sheep being herded by a Carlow farmer using a remote controlled drone. The drone itself is filming the sheep while it moves them around the fields and the film is speeded up to a soundtrack of music familiar from the Benny Hill shows. I saw the farmer being interviewed on TV where, when asked how his sheepdog felt about it, said the sheepdog was sitting outside the back door enjoying a Pina Colada, having retired from shepherding duties. Drones, as they get better and cheaper, are now used for all sort of activities some very worthwhile, some totally irresponsible and dangerous.

When we were in Estonia last year we met a BBC reporter and a cameraman who were doing a piece about the popularity of bear watching. The sweeping overhead shots of vast forests they later used in their report were shot by a drone and drones are now often used by reporters to film trouble spots during warfare without putting a cameraman or pilot in danger.

There has been a degree of controversy in the falconry community as to the ethics of using drones to train birds of prey. Some birds have actually been trained to attack the drones themselves which could result in injury for the bird while other owners have dangled a lure, which would previously have been hung from a kite or balloon, underneath the drone which means it is far enough away from the drone to ensure there is no collision while simultaneously filming the bird spectacularly snatching the lure.

Drones have been banned from some US parks due to their potential disturbance of resident raptors but elsewhere they have also proved to be very useful in some aspects of wildlife conservation. In Indonesia and Malaysia conservationists working to protect orangutans use drones to monitor the animals in areas of rainforest that would be virtually inaccessible to humans as well as monitoring illegal clearance of forest. In Africa the WWF (World Wildlife Fund) plans on using drones to help protect elephants and rhinos by tracking poachers from the air. In Britain drones have recently been used to monitor the nests of Hen Harriers; very endangered ground nesting raptors who would be very disturbed by any human presence but will apparently tolerate a high flying machine.

Dún Laoghaire Cruise-Berth Proposal

At the end of this April/early May, a finalised planning application from Dún Laoghaire Harbour Company on the proposed yet controversial €18m Cruise-Berth, is to be lodged to An Bord Pleanála along with an (EIS) Environmental Impact Statement.

The application followed a two-week Consultation Process for the general public and stakeholders to make submissions to DLHC. The proposed 435m jetty includes a 300m quay to handle cruiseships even longer of that length at a site near the harbour's centre and entrance. This issue formed part of the debate. Also raised was the financial merit from such business directly benefiting Dún Laoghaire and nearby Dalkey. Add to the mix, the backdrop of Dublin Port's plan for a \leqslant 30m cruise terminal.

In previous 'Maritime' Dalkey coverage that focused on 'cruiseships' notably over the last three years, this was to highlight the changing dynamics of Dublin Bay and of the sheer physical size that these massive cruiseships potentially pose in occupying within Dún Laoghaire Harbour. Albeit, not fixed structures, they will certainly make an impact that may prove debatable for some on the local character of the harbour when compared to perhaps the romance of anchoring in Dublin Bay.

Should such larger ships dock in Dún Laoghaire, they will easily be bigger than the 3,000 passenger 'QM2' (see, July 2013 issue & photo from Bulloch). The 151,000 tonnes Cunard 'liner' in height terms is 61.9m compared to the now laid-up fast-ferry HSS Stena Explorer of only 22.5m.

Given the HSS (High-speed Sea Service) is no more, one could adapt the terminology to Huge-Scale Sided ships! DLHC wants to emulate Cobh Cruise Terminal's capability to handle such larger cruise ships, as they claim if facilities are not put in place, Ireland risks losing on expanding cruise markets.

This April the Port of Cork Company are to have completed an upgrade in Cobh to accept Europe's largest cruiseships, the Mega 'Quantum' class 168,000 tonnes carrying almost 5,000 passengers.

As for Dún Laoghaire's first caller this season on 11 May, MSC's *Splendida*, of 137,000 tonnes has a 3,900 passenger capacity and 1,300 crew. In total a record 22 callers are to bring an estimated 100,000 passengers and crew in 2015. QM2 is to call again and P&O's *Britannia* of 143,000 tonnes.

Quirky 'Sounding' Craft As a resident close to Dalkey Sound over the years, the variety of vessels witnessed is broad and some are rather unusual looking, noting the SGT Pepper. The multi-cat workboat (with its name referencing to the 'Beatles' eighth-studio album), saw the craft contribute in constructing Greystones Marina. She made for a serial sight as a cargo van was parked on board.

Holyhead NO, Howth YES On a related note to car-carrying craft, the aforementioned HSS *Stena Explorer* which made her final voyage last September following closure of the historic Ireland-Wales link, saw Stena Line concentrate on the existing Dublin Port-Holyhead route. As alluded to in the last issue, this leaves Dún Laoghaire with only one notable passenger-

operator; in the form of **Dublin Bay Cruises.** As mentioned before, DBC runs an evening cruise through Dalkey Sound to Killiney Bay, however, they also serve Dún Laoghaire-Howth. The harbour to harbour link is somewhat ironic as the Royal Mail Packets in 1834 transferred operations from Howth to Dun Laoghaire after completion of the East Pier in Dún Laoghaire. Finally, all may not be over as regards the Holyhead ferry, as DLHC sought and received seven interested parties to resume the seasonal-only service. Should this became a reality, the port company cite this would not be until 2016.

Spring is at its height this month. Our Dawn Chorus is now a medley of native and migrant birds and our wildflowers are beautifully colouring our landscapes. Some of our herbaceous borders are growing in leaps and bounds. Is it not clear to us that our summer is approaching? In some ways, I don't need a list of what to do in the garden in May because every time I walk out there, the jobs are staring at me, straight in the face! When buying plants especially summer

bedding, look for the ones that are green,

healthy and bushy with plenty of flower buds rather than open blooms. Some people believe that clashing colours don't seem to matter in the garden - get out there: 'The World Really is Your Oyster!' Vine Weevil larvae just love containerised plants and become active this month. Tip out the rootball of suspect plants and inspect for creamy, orange headed maggots which tend to curl up in a 'C' shape; there are various biological controls available. Likewise check lilies for red lily beetles and their yellow larvae. These bright red little darlings with their black heads and their yellow larvae can strip plants in days!

Some Micro Greens to Grow Right Now

Micro leaves are simply herbs and leafy greens in miniature and are just as full of goodness. In fact studies have found that important nutrients are four times more concentrated in micro form than in the mature, fully grown plants. Their flavour is also more intense in their first true leaves. Micro leaves are also usually eaten fresh and raw, there is no point in cooking their so tiny leaves and the fresher they are the more health giving vitamins and minerals they contain. Each little leaf is basically a goldmine of vitamins, antioxidants and minerals, such as iron, folic acid and potassium. The Garden Centres are full of teenage plantlets of salads, herbs and vegetables. For those that find growing from seed daunting this is the ideal solution. A special friend of mine was shopping locally last Saturday and left outside our hall door, a surprise of some beautiful fresh watercress. I noticed, some of the watercress had roots so before annihilating some I potted up several of these juicy delicious peppery roots. Now, we have three good sized pots of watercress, at our beck and call!

Some Micro Greens to Grow Generally

Rocket, radish, coriander (use the red-stemmed leaves), Pak Choi, mustard, watercress, basil, fennel, mizuna and flat leafed parsley.

MIGHT DO MAYBE MAY JOBS

- 1. Clean your greenhouse to keep pests and diseases at bay. Sweep benches and wash them down with garden disinfectant. I am promising myself, I will do same, before this coming weekend!
 - Look out for crevices where pests hide. Cleaning the glass also allows more light in.
- 2. Continue removing moss and weeds from terraces, paths and driveways; I find the very best way to remove weeds is to simply dig each one out by its roots, especially before they self seed.
- 3. Remember not to be beguiled by warm days. A late spring frost will wreck and cause havoc with your summer bedding unless protected and hardened off. (Harden the half-hardy plants by leaving them outside during the day and bringing them back under cover at night).

4. Prune back spring flowering shrubs after flowering. Please check for nesting birds before clipping hedges.

- 5. It's a good idea to remove duckweed and blanket weed from ponds and thin excessive growth of submerged oxygenators. Lay removed weeds beside the pond overnight in order to allow insects, snails and other pond life to escape back to the water.
- 6. Keep mint roots under control by lifting and dividing or alternatively grow in pots. Once within a pot, they can be buried within a bed with other herbs, if preferred.
- 7. As we know, our water is such a precious commodity, so a good compost, supplemented with plenty of horticultural grit in tube and note we

So what is all the fuss about Riedel glasses? Surely if you pour the same wine into two different glasses the wine should taste the exact same?

As we all know, there are five senses that drive our perception- sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch. When it comes to wine the most important are smell and taste, just as important as each other in fact. After extensive wine tastings over a number of years Georg's father Claus, in 1958, created a glass that was 'wine friendly'. Unfortunately, they don't come cheap but I believe it is worth having a few in your press, because after much research, I have yet to find a sceptic- wine does in fact taste better from a Riedel glass.

In a recent interview Georg has said that his next challenge is to create the Riedel water glass, a hard challenge indeed especially when it has no taste or smell! "So where can I get these revolutionary glasses that are going to change the way I drink wine forever?" I hear you ask. Well Riedel's main distributor in Ireland is Mitchell & Son Wine Merchant's. Your nearest store is located in Glasthule. However, with the lovely weather we are experiencing you might like to take a trip out to Wicklow and visit their store in Avoca Kilmacanogue. They stock a wide range of Riedel glassware and decanters. However, we should always remember the important rule when it comes to any quality wine glasses you may havewash them the next day and NOT just after you have finished the bottle!

ASK THE PHARMACIST - Part 4



Q.I have recently been noticing that my eyes and nose are very itchy and I have clear tears coming from my eyes and a blocked nose. I remember getting similar symptoms last year about the same time but they went away again.



What do you think could be causing it?

A. What you are describing is most probably Hayfever which is an allergic condition to various pollens in the air. It normally starts in April when tree pollens start to appear (although it can happen earlier depending on weather conditions) and peaks in May-July when the grass pollen is at its highest level.

Symptoms of Hayfever include:

- Runny nose: a clear, thin and watery discharge
- Blocked nose
- Itchy nose and roof of the mouth

- Sneezing
- Itchy and watery eyes

Hayfever is normally diagnosed based on the time of year the symptoms occur and the fact that it recurs year on year.

Hayfever can normally be managed quite simply with Over-The-Counter medicines which can be recommended by the Pharmacist.

The first ones that we would normally recommend to try are Antihistamine tablets. These are available in a number of different forms some that are taken once daily and others up to three times daily. They come in both branded and generic form so ask the Pharmacist for the best product for you.

Decongestants can be used to help with the symptoms of the blocked nose and are especially helpful short term while waiting for antihistamines or steroids to take effect.

Steroid nasal sprays would be recommended when antihistamines are not effective at managing the symptoms and they act to dampen down inflammation in the nasal passage which relieves the itching and runny nose.

Antihistamine eye drops can be used with antihistamine tablets or on their own depending on severity of the symptoms and they work locally in the eyes to bring down redness, itchy and discharge.




