NW: Sgt. Paul Roche gave members advice on remaining secure in the home and especially as the darker evenings approach. Sweden, The Netherlands, Italy, France and Ireland, were fulsome in their praise of the completely immersive literary day, full of new information, fun and anecdotes.

An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Tom Murphy opened proceedings. **Prof Margaret Kelleher** UCD set out a most enlightening case as to why Maeve Binchy's work should be seen as social chronicle of Ireland and England in the 70s, 80s and 90s.

Contemporary writers Martina Devlin, Joe O'Connor and Róisín Ingle teased out connections between journalism and creative writing. Sarah Binchy, RTE producer, described how she had collated Maeve's journalism as a teenager. She and her brother Chris, also a writer, shared what it had

been like to have a famous and encouraging Auntie.

There were numerous highlights throughout the day.

Barry McGovern A rare, extended interview with leading actor Barry McGovern was most insightful on the humanity of Samuel Beckett.

Striking a Pose for my Country The reading of Maeve's account of sitting for her portrait by renowned Irish artist Maeve McCarthy, commissioned by the National Gallery of Ireland, was thoroughly enjoyed by all including the artist who was in attendance.

Prof John McCourt, University Trieste wove an intricate web around Maeve, James Joyce and Flann O'Brien and found links in the most unlikely of places.

Gunilla Sondell, Maeve's Swedish publisher and Chris Green, her literary agent regaled the audience with many previously untold stories, including ones on Maeve the Matchmaker.

Maeve's incredible work ethic was referenced constantly by those who worked closely with her professionally.

Playwright Bernard Farrell brought Saturday's event to a close with a thoughtful and considered account of his years of friendship with Maeve and Gordon. He had the audience rolling in the aisles with his account of how Maeve always insisted he told his 'potage du jour'story at their gatherings!

Thanks to DLR Festival & Events support and Creative Ireland. There were many competitions along the way in the lead in to ECHOES, which got great local support. The prize winners from the international TBEX travel bloggers conference in Killarney came to Dublin especially for ECHOES. They were generously accommodated as part of their prize in Fitzpatrick's Castle Hotel, Killiney. They were further treated to lunches in the Dalkey **Duck**, and dinner at **1909** and **Ouzos** in Dalkey.

FREE SECONDARY EDUCATION



50th ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the introduction of Free Secondary Education. In 1967 the Minster for Education, Donogh O'Malley, made a brave decision and introduced free secondary education for all. In those days, a high number of children left school early. I remember girls staying on in 6th class for a further two years until they reached the age of 14 and then entered the job market or they left primary and went to the Tec. for two years. It was only those who could afford fees that sent their children to secondary and money was very scarce during the 1950's and 1960's. Although not all the secondary schools entered the scheme, those that did provided an opportunity for children to remain in education and achieve a better qualification. Now the outlook looked brighter and the workplace opened up especially for girls – rather than being in administrative work, typists, clerks, etc. with a certificate we could venture onto Third Level where a whole new world was on offer. At this time we in Dalkey National School were very lucky to have some teachers who had great ability to tap into the potential of their students and help them on their educational path.

We were in the right place at the right time and thanks to them, and the bold decision of the Minister, our future became brighter!



A BICYCLE OF HISTORICAL IMPORTANCE

The attached is possibly one of the oldest bicycles still in use. I'm not sure of its make but pleased to see that it is still upright.

When I was very much younger I used see its owner cycling around Dalkey as he went about his work, calling to many houses, including ours on Ardeevin Road.

As you can see it's a Gentleman's 'Upstairs' model of a different era. It

would not at all surprise me if it was originally his father's bike as he went about his work as a member of the police force. I often saw it carefully parked in the front garden of his home on Railway Road, directly next door to what is now the Guinea Pig restaurant. I knew he played tennis as I used see him astride his bike, with bag carefully balanced on crossbar and handlebar. In 1954 two of my classmates, Ray Lyons and Dan Gleeson, asked me if I would like to join Sandycove LTC. They made the overtures on my behalf and he, the cyclist, proposed me for membership. I knew well of the club as both my sisters had been members, although both had moved on for other sporting reasons.

Naturally enough, I cycled or walked to Elton Park where we whiled away our Summer school holidays, wet or fine, playing tennis, table tennis or having occasional bike races around the courts. When we graduated to Intermediate or Senior status we were permitted to play in the evenings, one of the ever present seniors would be our man on his bike. In fact, he captained my first league outing for the club, played in Taney Parish LTC. We won the match 6-3!

He later encouraged a few of us to join Clarinda Badminton Club, who played in Dalkey Town Hall, alas since defunct. With him I had the great pleasure of supporting the nomination of one of Clarinda greats to join Sandycove, the outstanding Vinnie Dunphy whose contribution to the Club surpasses all others and all done in true sporting fashion. I'm minded of accompanying him on occasion to Milltown for Shamrock Rovers matches, sometimes playing against Dundalk. I can still hear one lady supporter of Dundalk, above all other voices shouting in very Louth accent (almost a banshee tenor!) *Come on Dundalk!* She was famous.

The years rolled by and not long after he died his sister, Sheila, gifted the treasured steed to a young eager member of Sandycove, Brendan Hennessy, note Hennessy! Brendan moved to Cork, bringing the bike with him. Not only has Brendan kept the bike, which survived the destruction of the Aghada Tennis Club premises, but he has taken it on a variety of excursions including the Ring of Kerry. We met yesterday as he and his parents, Jeremy and Nadine, were in Dalkey at the funeral of Conrad, Jeremy's brother.


What a bike! What a man!


We went to Donegal for a week in July and on announcing our intended destination we received many ominous warnings about the weather. Sure enough we left Dublin in baking sunshine with the temperature in the mid-20s and by the time we reached Donegal it was raining heavily. But next day the sun was out and it was glorious as we drove north beside a sparkling sea stopping at a viewing area overlooking a lovely little bay where Lucy spotted a Porpoise with a calf. We were heading to Slieve League. I'd visited the famous cliffs back in 1995 but there was nothing then like the throngs of

visitors that were there this time. It has two car parks, one at the base of the winding road the other at the top near the cliffs, full of cars, camper vans and fast food stalls. Taking advantage of the crowds or, more specifically, the uneaten food they leave behind were a pair of ravens, hopping around a few feet away and occasionally perching on direction signs. Further up the coast at Glencolumcill we got our only sighting of Chough when a little flock flew over. One place in Donegal we specifically wanted to visit was a nature reserve at a beach at Sheskinmore which earlier this year featured in a wonderful wildlife documentary about the Wild Atlantic Way, in a sequence where a nesting Skylark was filmed bringing food to its young. The cameraman had told us it was a lovely area with the beach backing onto dunes covered with wildflowers. As we wound along the path, lined with Common Spotted and Pyramidal Orchids, towards the beach a large raptor flew over, though only getting a glimpse, it was almost certainly a female Marsh Harrier. The beach was as lovely as we anticipated; miles of white sand with only a handful of people on a warm summer's day and as we rounded one headland we saw a big raft of ducks cruising through the surf. They were Eider, the largest of our duck species, beautiful birds with their distinctive sloping forehead who breed on many of the uninhabited islands off the Donegal coast. Further along Ringed Plover rushed around the beach probably having nested nearby.

We stayed in Dunfanaghy and went on a lovely walk which passes along Tramore Beach before coming back through a pine wood. The start of the walk passes through a nature reserve where a signpost explained its importance as a breeding habitat for the caterpillars of the day flying Cinnabar moth. The caterpillars feed on ragwort and absorb the toxic substances from the plant making themselves unpalatable to predators. The caterpillars have the classic, warning to predators, colours of yellow and black stripes and the adult moth's black body and vivid red wings send out a similar warning sign to anything that might want to eat them. We had arrived as the ragwort was in flower among the dunes and virtually every plant had cinnabar caterpillars feeding on them, thousands of them. I was thinking such a large number of caterpillars facing no threat from predators must be very successful but apparently they will often totally devour their food plants and lots end up starving or resorting to cannibalism. We emerged from the dunes onto another stretch of long pristine sandy beach again almost empty of people and made our way over to where the path continued up slopes of soft grasses with a lovely patch of vivid



pink ragged robin beside us and it was here, feeding on clover, I saw one of the highlights of our trip, a Dark Green Fritillary butterfly. Our next B&B stay had our most unlikely sighting of the trip when, walking up a hill side, we saw a llama sitting between some gorse bushes, evidently left to wander the hillside like the sheep.

Our final destination in Donegal was Burt where a nature reserve runs around some of the banks of Drongawn Lough and though a fairly persistent drizzle was coming down when we reached there a walk down the path was accompanied by Meadow Pipits, Stonechat and Reed Bunting while Swifts and Sand Martins skimmed over the water catching low flying insects. We were staying in Burt because of its proximity to the town of Muff and specifically a little wood there called Lis Na Gra where there's a well-known population of red squirrels. They're something of a tourist attraction and are given supplementary food by a local wildlife group. We went that evening to find the wood's location, planning on going again early the following morning when the squirrels would, hopefully, be active. A lovely wood, with stately old beeches, moss covered fallen trunks and nicely spaced Scots Pine letting sunlight beam into the woods. Jays moved through the trees and a Buzzard called from above. As we returned to our B&B a car in front stopped on the road and put on its warning lights. The driver got out, went to the other side of the road and picked up something. It was a young swallow, which had been hit by a

passing car. On our way to the wood I'd wondered at the agility of the swallows flying so low along the same high hedged road sweeping up insects but this unfortunate hadn't made it. I thought it very decent of the other driver to stop and try to help the bird but there was blood coming from its bill and it passed away soon after.

The next morning we were up early and off to Lis Na Gra Wood again getting there by 6.30a.m. We were only there a few minutes when Lucy heard scales dropping down from a cone and we saw a beautiful red squirrel sitting high up in the Scots Pine we'd parked under. Another couple of people arrived who'd just driven from Derry. This was a favourite spot of theirs to visit and they told us a lot of newlyweds come there to have their wedding photos taken. I don't think there was anywhere we visited in Donegal that we wouldn't go to again and though the time we visited was great for wild flowers and butterflies we'd love to visit in spring or early summer when skylarks are singing and cuckoos are calling.
