**The Barber Surgeon** has medieval ways of curing their ailments, as he has all the sharp knives. He hangs out the bloody bandages to dry on the pole in the wind, so passers-by know he is in town.

**Irish Mead** The Cook will give them mouth-watering recipes, including a taster of her favourite, traditional Irish Mead from the horn cup.

**Bodhrán Buzz Taster** We follow the Living History tour with a Bodhrán Buzz Taster Session in the Writers' Gallery. This is led by Irish Champion Bodhrán player, Robbie Walsh. The Bodhrán is particularly appropriate as it made from goat skin... so traditional to Goat Castle! Robbie, in a short space of time, has everyone joining in the fun of playing Irish jigs and reels. It's amazing to watch!

**Dining Options** The group then goes for dinner to one of three restaurants in Dalkey that can provide a private dining room where they can eat and network after the day's business meetings. This is followed by a trip to one of the pubs to sample some Guinness.

Three times we've been to Kilmacurragh National Botanic Gardens and each time we've gone on the guided walk with three different guides each equally knowledgeable and entertaining. This time, visiting in early June we were too late for the spectacular early spring colour display of the rhododendrons although apparently this year it had been dampened by the horribly cold wet weather of early spring and buds of some of the plants had dropped off the bushes without even opening. Still it was lovely when we did get there, the heatwave still in place and the wildflower meadows full of rattle, buttercups, oxeye daisies and early flowering orchids.

Our guide was telling us a lovely grass floored avenue between a line of deciduous trees had at one stage been the main Wexford road and the ruins of a small building nearby had



probably been where they collected tolls from travelers and pilgrims. From further up the avenue a sharp 'whick' call from the trees had us both say to each other with some excitement, was that a woodpecker? The male only makes the famous drumming sound in spring to attract a mate and signify it's holding a territory but the rest of the year its presence can be detected by a call very similar to what we'd heard. We continued on the walk and were once again pleased we'd opted for accompanying a guide who brought so much of the plants and their history to life. After the walk concluded we wandered up by the meadows adjoining the avenue. On one raised mound there was evidence of recent digging and initially I thought the amount of soil disturbed and the sheer size of the two holes made into it must have been done by someone using a small digger or some sort of machinery. But Lucy spotted a number of bees crawling through the soil, some distressed and some almost lifeless and we knew it wasn't a machine that had dug down into their nest but a badger. We've seen it quite a few times, an underground bees' nest in disarray looking like it had been hit by an air strike with dead and confused bees around the excavated entrance. The badgers aren't looking for honey but are after the grubs the colony will be attending to. Much as I love badgers you'd feel very sorry for the bees although in the UK people who support badger culling in order to prevent TB in cattle cite badgers as being a threat to declining bee populations as another reason to destroy them. We meandered around the grounds spying a Red Kite and a Buzzard gliding across the

warm air until we found ourselves back where we'd earlier heard what we thought was a Great Spotted Woodpecker and almost instantly heard the call again, much louder and closer and then one flew out of a tree overhead. Winding its way up the trunk of a tree we soon saw why it was making so much noise, there was at least one juvenile Woodpecker motionless in the fork of a tree waiting to be fed.

Later I told Birdwatch's Dick Coombes, who has been monitoring GS Woodpeckers since they recently began breeding in Ireland, about our sighting and he said he'd had a male Great Spotted Woodpecker drumming in Kilmacurragh a couple of years ago and was glad to get confirmed breeding for there. So far this year he has already got a record number of 43 Woodpeckers nesting in Ireland.

The gardens' many old trees with their gnarled and fissured bark and lots of small apertures provide lots of good secure nest sites for smaller birds and we saw two Blue Tit nests in century old conifers but passing close to a old stone wall we got our most endearing sight when Lucy heard chicks calling and just inside one tiny space a newly born chick was stretching up and gaping its bill alarmingly wide demanding to be fed. A few days before, walking down a farm lane we'd heard another noisy clamour of baby birds while a concerned Blue Tit fussed from the hedge then realised the nest was down an old rusty iron gate post. The chicks had hatched during a prolonged warm dry spell and I hope they'll still be ok when the rains come.

#### NEWS FROM LORETO PRIMARY SCHOOL

On May 31st, the two fifth classes in Loreto went to the Irish Aid Centre in Dublin city. We travelled there on the DART. On the way to Harcourt Street, we walked through Trinity College and had a picnic.

Earlier in the year we did projects on Irish Aid and their work around the world. One of the groups did a voice recording about a primary school in Mozambique. Other groups did videos, letters, songs and poems.

When we arrived, we went into a room filled with 'djembe,' a type of African drum. We took a seat and a lady who worked in Irish Aid presented a PowerPoint about Tanzanian culture. We learnt a few proverbs in Swahili, including 'haraka haraka, haina baraka' meaning more haste less speed and 'mtu ni wa tu' meaning no man is an island. We got to try on 'khangas', colourful scarves, which are used in many different ways, such as skirts, carrying babies and carrying food. We learnt a song in Swahili called 'Hujambo' which means hello in English.

We then moved into another room and we played some more games. We all got a card with a year on it from 2016 to 2030. Next, we put ourselves in order and told each other how old we will be in that year. We brainstormed about what the world will be like in 2030. We hope that there will be no homelessness, no global warming, no poverty and that the world will be a better place for everyone. Then for the last few minutes, we watched the Malala video about the UN and the Global Goals.

The two classes really enjoyed the trip to Irish Aid. We learnt so much about Africa, its culture and the Global Goals. We also made some lasting memories with our class.



coffee cups and lids are issued in Ireland every day, it is time for serious action. On May 29th, Dalkey's NOSUPTOWN team accelerated their efforts further and invited selected experts, a group of suppliers of alternative non-plastic products, plus our own Dalkey Retailers to the Heritage Centre. With a total attendance of over one hundred, thirteen Retailers arrived to hear how they can help Dalkey to be a **NO SINGLE USE PLASTIC TOWN**. 



Minister Andrew Doyle officially launched the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine's (DAFM) "Don't Risk it!" campaign at Bloom on June bank holiday weekend where a staggering 119,000 people attended the event over 5 days. The "Don't Risk it!" campaign is a public awareness raising initiative targeting amateur gardeners and tourists about the risks involved in bringing plants, fruit, vegetables wood products and soil back home from abroad. Our objective is to highlight the social, environmental and economic impact of

bringing infected plant material or quarantine pests and diseases into Ireland. The Department of Agriculture, Food & the Marine carries out physical checks on all regulated and high risk consignments of commercial products from outside the EU, however it is not physically possible for DAFM to check every piece of hand luggage that comes through the airports and ports. Therefore, by educating the public of the risks we will generate

awareness and hopefully reduce the number of unchecked plants and plant products stowed away in people's luggage. Currently a new disease, Xylella fastidiosa, which originated in South America. is threatening Europe -

primarily the olive industry and in particular the Puglia region of Italy where the disease first appeared in Europe in 2013. This disease is of major concern to the nursery stock industry in Ireland as it has a host range of over 350 species (full list available on the Departments website). The organisers of Bloom took this issue so seriously they encouraged its participants not to use any of the host species during the event. Legally there are no restrictions on using these host species provided they are accompanied by a valid plant passport. The Department also

highlighted many other pests and diseases of concern such as the **Emerald Ash Borer**, a damaging pest of the ash tree that can hide in untreated wood packaging material, the **Colorado Beetle** which can destroy potato crops, and the **Citrus Longhorn Beetle** which can do untold damage to a wide range of deciduous trees - also hiding in untreated timber products. The Department also promoted their dedicated website (www.agriculture.gov.ie/dontriskit) for the campaign with information on all the pests

Overall it was a very successful campaign launch that received an unprecedented level of interest from members of the public. Our twitter activity also engaged with an additional 40,000 individuals during the 5 days of the show. We hope to build on the campaign for next year and perhaps come up with more novel ways of getting our "Don't Risk it!" message out to the public.




#### ASK THE PHARMACIST – TRAVEL HEALTH



**A:** One of the first things to include in your medicines is a small travel first aid kit to include plasters, antiseptic cream, tweezers, sunburn treatment and pain killers.

Most importantly don't forget your regular medicines!

For insect bites we recommend bringing an insect repellent to avoid



For stomach upsets include an anti-diarrhoeal medicine and anti-nausea medicine, both of which come in a formulation that dissolves on the tongue for ease of use. Just be sure to check with your Pharmacist that they are compatible with your regular medicines.

Oral rehydration salts are also beneficial for this and are available in individual sachets.

Sunscreen is very important to bring if travelling to a country where it is likely to be sunny. The SPF gives a measure of how much protection the sunscreen provides against UVB and goes up to SPF 50. The sunscreen should also have UVA rating and this should be at least a 4 star rating. Reapplication of sunscreen is the most effective way to prevent sun damage and should be applied liberally and frequently and at least 30 minutes before going into the sun.

Many tropical areas require specific vaccines and/or anti malarial medications so check with a Tropical Travel Medical Centre before you go to make sure you are covered for all tropical illnesses. Finally if travelling within the EU ensure you have an E111 travel card with you to avail of the local healthcare free of charge. This can be arranged through your local health centre.

#### OBSERVED BY THE DALKEY LOOK-OUT POST – AUGUST 27th 1941

According to Daily Reports Summary 602, between 10 a.m. and 10.20 p.m., an unidentified aircraft was observed flying 6 miles east of the post in a northerly direction. It was later observed by the military on Dublin's Bull Wall 4 miles north flying in northwesterly direction at a high altitude.

Between 3.25 p.m. and 3.29 p.m. both the Dalkey and Bray look-out posts reported an unidentified aircraft flying southwards 8 to 9 miles out to sea.

#### **PUBLICATIONS**

'Luftwaffe Eagles Over Ireland: The Story of German Air Crashes over Neutral Ireland 1940 – 1945' by Justin Horgan and Paddy Cummins, published by Horgan Press, Ardfert, Co. Kerry.

Once the Germans occupied Western France in June 1940, the Luftwaffe (German Air Force) gained bases from which they could fly out deep into the North Atlantic or up and down the Irish Sea and this excellent fascinating book records those aircraft which crashlanded in Ireland during this period for a variety of reasons such as damage sustained from attacks by R.A.F. fighters, or anti-aircraft fire from ships, lack of fuel, mechanical failure or navigation error.

In some cases, the crews were lost but others survived and these were interned in the Curragh Camp while the Defence Forces tried to salvage what they could from the remains of the crashed aircraft.

Based on those crashes which the authors could investigate, this book is a wealth of photographs, Irish documents, German documents, eye witness accounts of the crashes, augmented with the recollections of those who were interned. Included in the book are brief biographies of those who were interned and their post World War 2 career lives.

This book is a comprehensive account of an aspect of the Emergency not previously covered in any book and is an essential acquisition for anyone interested in the Emergency or Irish aviation history.
