❖ DALKEY CASTLE & HERITAGE CENTRE UPDATE

At Dalkey Castle, we love the element of surprise when unexpected co-incidences occur with the visitors who arrive for the various experiences we offer. We had two of these surprises recently.

The first was a request for a special treat for an English lady's birthday from one of her family. The birthday lady was a big Maeve Binchy fan. She had read all her books and was an avid admirer. The family enquired if Dalkey Castle could put on the *Marvellously Maeve Guided Walk* that we usually reserve for the ECHOES weekend in October. Needless to say, we were extremely happy to oblige.

The walk covers many of the more famous Maeve stories including her great love of Dalkey, where she lived most of her life with her husband, Gordon Snell. Part of the experience includes the story of the 'Rosa Gordon Snell'. Rita Biggs, our excellent guide, told the background to the story of how Maeve had commissioned the rose for Gordon's 65th birthday.

Colin Dickson in Newtownards Co. Down bred the rose. Dickson's had been founded in 1836. Colin started in the breeding house in 1977. For his services to horticulture, Colin was included in Queen Elizabeth II's Birthday Honour's List and was awarded an MBE in 2022. Lots of subterfuge had gone on for nearly two years to keep the planned surprise a secret from Gordon. The rose is a floribunda with a hue described as 'floribunda yellow flushed with scarlet'. Colin launched it at the Chelsea Flower Show. Ever one to celebrate an occasion, Maeve brought Gordon over to meet his namesake.

Upon hearing the story, one of the visitors mentioned that co-incidentally they knew quite a lot about roses as they were of the rose growing family of Harkness. The Harknesses have

specialised in creating new varieties of roses for five generations in Bedfordshire, England. They have recently released some extremely popular new cultivars including 'The Captain Tom Rose', 'The Duke of Edinburgh Rose' and 'The Queen Elizabeth II Rose'. In all, the company has won over twenty-five medals at Chelsea Flower Show, eighteen of them gold.

The group occupied a table under Maeve's photo in Finnegan's and reminisced on the serendipity of the occasion. It was deemed to be the best birthday celebration ever. All were delighted with the horticultural and literary connections they had made in Dalkey and have already booked to come back for ECHOES in October.

Hot on the heels of the Harkness experience, another special request landed on our doorstep, once again centred around Maeve Binchy.

The British Ambassador, Paul Johnston and his wife Nicola had special guests arriving who were, you have guessed it, dedicated Maeve Binchy fans. They had all been to ECHOES with the Ambassador, but due to illness had missed our production of Maeve's *Aches and Pains*, adapted by Shay Linehan.

Maeve wrote Aches and Pains as a 'Cheer Up' book, after her hip operation. In the book, she offers hilarious advice on motivating the patient in the next bed; hiding being lame; visiting a nudist colony; becoming a friend to your feet; terrific things to do when getting old; how to give up drink and many more unique and 'Maeviously' wonderful perspectives on life. The late Shay Linehan captured the essence of Maeve's book in his sensitive, laugh-out-loud adaptation.

A private performance was duly arranged in Dalkey Castle with Caitríona



Ní Threasaigh as Ann and Michael Heavey as Stan. All had a most enjoyable evening. Paul and Nicola and their party were delighted with the special performance. They assured us that the Rosa Gordon Snell that Gordon had gifted them at Christmas time was flourishing in the garden at Glencairn. There are seven Gordon Snell roses growing onsite now at Dalkey Castle.

Our next theatrical event will be our Bloomsday Festival on 15th & 16th June. Joycean celebrations begin on the eve of Bloomsday with 'A Joycean Evening'. A team of actors will perform enlightening extracts from *Ulysses, Dubliners, A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man*, and more. Josh Johnson will accompany Tenor, Simon Morgan and Soprano, Donna Malone in songs that James Joyce sang, or which feature in his work. Refreshments will be served, and you can wander outside to see the Gordon Snell roses which should be in full bloom by then.

On Bloomsday, Friday 16th June the Nestor Episode from *Ulysses* (Dalkey Schoolroom Scene) will be brought to life before your eyes in a memorable dramatisation featuring Mr. Deasy (Headmaster) and Stephen Dedalus (James Joyce). James Joyce taught at the Clifton School in Dalkey in 1904. Following the performance at Dalkey Castle, a Guided Joycean Walk will be led by an expert Joycean Guide, Joe Dunne, to the setting of the former schoolroom on Dalkey Avenue. Many thanks to Caroline and Barry for allowing Joyceans to admire the gates and gardens to see where "the sun flung spangles, dancing coins" each Bloomsday.

Dalkey - Looking Back


Easter Sunday 1906 fell on April 15th in an era the emphasis of Easter was one of spiritual renewal within the various Christian churches with none of the commercialisation that has become the main feature of Easter in recent years. Local papers of that time are devoid of any advertisements for Easter promotions and the only mention of it relates to various services of worship taking place in local churches during Holy Week. Weather wise summer type weather was the main feature of Easter Sunday and Monday that year with large numbers of people travelling out to Dalkey, Killiney and Bray to avail of what all these locations had to offer for the day visitor.



THE FUTURE OF 'EIRE' AT HAWK CLIFF IS SECURED FOR POSTERITY

In October 2021, Dalkey Tidy Towns team guided DLR Councillors Justin Moylan, Lorraine Hall, Tom Kivlehan, Melisa Halpin, Michael Clark and Denis O'Callaghan and also Cormac Devlin TD to Hawk Cliff below the Vico Road to help them appreciate for themselves the significance of our 2018 DTT excavation of EIRE. Our concern was that following the discovery, excavation and subsequent maintenance by DTT volunteers, over time, it might all disappear once again through neglect or just human forgetfulness unless a long-term plan was put in place.

Thankfully, this site visit made an impact on our Councillors and resulted in the passing of a very significant Council proposal:

"To offer a requisite level of protection and maintenance to the site known as Eire sign #7 such that this site will be afforded protection from any future activities which may either intentionally or unintentionally damage, undermine or remove this important historical heritage site and that this Council agrees to a reasonable level of maintenance of the site insofar as is practicable."

While the maintenance details were being organised, DTT continued to take care of the regular work as they had done since the 2018 discovery. However, on March 27th 2023, the appointed DLR Contractors arrived on site to take over the maintenance work - and that makes an enormous difference. EIRE's survival is no longer dependent on our local DTT Volunteers. THANK YOU COUNCILLORS & DLR - Our historic EIRE site should now be secured for future generations to enjoy and also be available for whatever WW2 1939/45 commemorations might take place in 2025.

ASK THE PHARMACIST - HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE





Q. I have been diagnosed with high blood pressure and my doctor is talking about starting me on tablets for this but first he would like me to try lifestyle changes – can you give me some advice?

*

A. Normal blood pressure readings are usually 120 (systolic) over 80 (diastolic). If these readings are 140/90 or higher it is diagnosed as High Blood Pressure or Hypertension. Blood pressure is measured in two numbers: the first number (systolic) records blood pressure when the pressure is at its highest (when the heart muscle squeezes out blood), and the second number (diastolic) is when the heart relaxes and allows blood to flow back into the heart.

High Blood Pressure has no symptoms and is a major risk factor for heart disease and stroke. The higher the blood pressure, the greater the risk. There is often no single cause for high blood pressure and it tends to run in families. It also increases as we get older so it is important to have it checked regularly to monitor for any increase in readings. Your GP may suggest a 24 hour blood pressure monitor which you wear for 24 hours and gives a more accurate overall picture.

There are certain lifestyle changes that can help to reduce blood pressure and if this is not sufficient then blood pressure lowering medication is used.

These steps are:

▼ Know your blood pressure reading: This is the best way to stay on top of your own

- health and to have it checked regularly by a GP or Pharmacist
- Aim for a healthy weight: Even losing 10% of any excess weight you may be carrying can lower blood pressure.
- ▼ Eat less salt and processed food: Salt increases your blood pressure so try to reduce or cut out its intake, while processed food contains a lot of hidden salt. Add more vegetables, fruit and wholegrain cereals to your diet.
- Drink less alcohol: Drinking alcohol can increase your blood pressure and may cause damage to the liver and heart.
- **▼ Be more active:** at least 30 minutes of moderate activity 5 times per week.
- Avoid other risk factors for heart disease: Smoking, high cholesterol and diabetes

If you are prescribed tablets for blood pressure it is important to take them as directed. These tablets lower blood pressure and prevent early ageing of blood vessels and reduce the risk of stroke and you are normally on them for life. In general they have very few side effects but if they don't suit you there are many other options for the doctor to switch you over to. Always talk to your doctor first before stopping them.




The last few months we have been having a lot of events such as family day and Seachtain na Gaeilge (Irish week).

"Never mind the next world. Let's fix this one!" was the dominant response; as members of the audience demanded another meeting in which options would be explored and action initiated.

So May 9th in Our Lady's Hall was agreed as the date and place for this meeting, to which all are warmly invited. It will begin at 7.15pm with a welcoming cuppa before a formal start at 7.45pm. It will feature a special presentation by Dalkey Tidy Towns "supremo",

Des Burke-Kennedy, who is already relishing the prospect of expanding the Tidy Towns work with members of our Dalkey faith communities and perhaps our schools. "Sustainability is the major challenge," he says, "fostering plant and animal life, yes, but also putting an end to pollution of all kinds. We have to focus on how you and I can fix it. It may be expensive, but help is available." Reports from Tidy Towns activists Fiona Treacy and Susan McDonnell (chair of our Community Council) will also feature at the meeting, at which we also hope to hear from schools personnel.

Another anxiety expressed on March 21st was that of the spiritual nurture of our young people, which hopefully can be addressed at a subsequent meeting.

Oh How Television (and Radio) has changed over the years . . .

In 1987 RTE began building a broadcast tower in Co Meath. When it was completed in 1989 Atlantic 252 began broadcasting from the Co Meath site.

With a tower measuring 780 feet and a very powerful transmitter, the station could be received in most parts of Western Europe with a suitable radio. Soon after listener numbers began to drop, and as a result there were various re-brandings, none of which were successful.

RTE then started using the transmitter to broadcast Radio One, and did so until the 14th of April (2023), when due to running costs the service was switched off. Some estimates suggest that it had cost 2.5% of their annual budget to run the transmitter.
