# **❖** DALKEY CASTLE & HERITAGE CENTRE UPDATE

The team from Dalkey Castle and Deilg Inis headed out on the high seas with Dublin Bay Cruises to Howth recently. Last year, we had taken Ken's ferry to Dalkey Island with archaeologist, Chris Corlett. This year, we decided to go north to see, among other things, where Leopold Bloom proposed to Molly in *Ulysses* and if the Howth seagulls were as predatory of fish and chips as outlined on Joe Duffy recently.

**Looking out into Dublin Bay on a fine Tuesday in June,** we couldn't but think on the many uses of the sea, the stories it could tell, and how it has influenced our lives here along the coast. There was a large cruise liner moored whose passengers were gone to explore Dublin and Wicklow. People were paddle boarding; children were splashing their kayaks and yachts were sailing past. We remarked that the impressive statue of Roger Casement by sculptor Mark Richards has his back to the sea and is a prominent part of the new Dún Laoghaire Baths restoration project.

**Dublin Bay Cruises takes visitors daily between Dún Laoghaire, Dublin, Howth** and around Killiney Bay in the evenings. These cruise trips give locals and visitors alike an opportunity to see the mainland from a totally different angle. They give an added attraction to the tourism product of the county from April to September.

**Leaving the impressive Dún Laoghaire Harbour,** we saluted Capt. Toutcher whose dogged determination led to the building of the Harbour. Construction commenced in 1817, and the bulk of the granite to build the harbour walls was quarried at Dalkey. The entire area between the East and West Piers covers 251 acres. Parliament advanced nearly a million pounds towards the cost of construction, to be repaid by certain duties leviable off the vessels coming into it.

Admiring Dalkey Island to our right, we remember from our own guided tours, that the deep waters in Dalkey Sound provided a safe anchorage for the lightening of ships in the Middle Ages. Back then, the Liffey was tidal. It was much broader and shallower and suffered from silting, sandbars and flash flooding. The seven castles of Dalkey were built at this time, as temporary storage facilities for goods, before they were transported into Dublin.

Once the Passenger and Mail Packet Services began in the mid-1800s, income began to accrue. Four new ships: Leinster, Munster, Ulster and Connaught were built and came into service from the Carlisle Pier. When Victoria Wharf opened in 1850, the City of Dublin Steam Packet Company ran a passenger service between Kingstown and Holyhead with an average passage time of four to five hours. The Company also took over the Mail Service in the same year.

**The Bay also had its share of tragedies.** In 1807, a fearful disaster occurred in Dublin Bay. Two transport vessels, The Prince of Wales and The Rochdale, foundered on the rocky shoreline between Booterstown and Seapoint. The ships were transporting troops to the Napoleonic Wars. 380 lives were lost. There is a memorial stone in St. Begnet's Graveyard where some of the bodies were buried. It was this terrible tragedy that brought the agitation to a head for the building of an asylum harbour at Dunleary (as it was called then).

**Sadly, on the 10**th **of October 1918,** just one month before the end of the World War 1, the greatest disaster in the Irish Sea took place. The RMS Leinster, owned by the City of Dublin Steam Packet Company, sailed from Carlisle Pier on her daily journey to Holyhead. The Leinster was carrying 757 passengers and crew. Fourteen miles out from port, beyond the Kish Bank, she was torpedoed by a German U Boat. 501 people lost their lives. The ship's master, Captain Birch, went down with his ship.



**The Guide on Dublin Bay Cruises alerted us to the fact** that in recognition of its important habitats and diverse wildlife, Dublin Bay is now a designated UNESCO Biosphere with Howth protected by a Special Area Amenity Order. Biospheres are locations where a balanced relationship between nature and people is encouraged, allowing both to co-exist in a mutually beneficial way.

**Today, Fáilte Ireland recognises the value of promoting** the fact that the sea horseshoes around the city. They have set up a new Dublin Coastal Trail and it is fully branded along the city's stunning coast. Stretching from Skerries in North Dublin to Killiney in South Dublin, the trail is easily accessible by rail and encourages visitors to journey out of the city, bringing new life to Dublin's coastline. Dalkey features strongly. Just google Dublin Coastal Trail and be delighted.

**Having reached our destination at Howth,** our first stop was Beshoff's. They really do serve wonderful fish and chips. Caitriona Ní Threasaigh performed part of Molly Bloom's soliloquy while we all picnicked. The seagulls did hover and squawk but there were no thieving incidents to report to Joe Duffy.

## NATURE CORNER Michael Ryan

I was walking past someone as they admired a little blue butterfly as it flitted around. Her older companion said regretfully there used be lots of them around years ago. I managed to restrain myself from butting in with the recently gained information that in fact that particular species of butterfly, the Holly Blue, is one of the few species of Irish butterfly that is actually doing very well and probably in the species of the second of the sec

increasing its population.
That's according to Jesmond Harding and if anyone would know he would. He'd recently given a fascinating talk on Ireland's butterfly species for the local branch of BirdWatch, he being one of the founders of Butterfly Conservation Ireland and principal contributor to its excellent website. He has produced a book The Irish Butterfly

Book, available from the website, which documents the full life cycle of every Irish butterfly from egg to adult butterfly and includes 400 original colour photographs which are truly stunning.

At the talk he said holly blues are doing particularly well in gardens especially around Dublin. It was known previously that whereas further north of Dublin holly blues had one brood a year, holly blues in the city and further south had two broods due to the milder climate but he said it's a probability that Southside holly blues now actually have three broods a year. We regularly get holly blues in our garden, tiny elegant little creatures and once again this year I've been privileged to see one landing on a holly tree where they will lay their eggs on the flowers. Sadly in general Ireland's butterflies aren't doing well and one species in particular that Jesmond considers in concerning decline is one I have often mentioned as being regularly

Graylings are frequently found around coastal habitats and Jesmond cites a survey done along a number of east coast locations, Bull Island, Howth, Portmarnock and Portrane, where the butterfly was once common but in

was found. One potential cause of their decline is damage to sand dunes and grasslands through disturbance or being overgrown with scrub reducing the grasses the grayling's caterpillars feed on.

Jesmond mentioned another more complex series of reasons which he kindly outlined for me. below.

'Research into the decline of other species with grass-feeding larvae strongly suggests declines are connected with pollution arising from burning fossil fuels and agriculture creating nitrogen-enriched soils which some species cannot tolerate when the foodplants absorb the additional nutrients. A warming climate is creating a longer growing season which, together with the higher nutrient content, produces a higher proportion of green vegetation to dry, dead plant litter that is vital for increasing the larvae's body temperature. Body temperature is important for larval development, especially in early spring. Digestive enzymes cannot function below a certain temperature. Thus, counter-intuitively, the micro-habitats of larvae are cooling under the warming climate. This along with larvae having their nitrogen tolerance levels exceeded, may, in addition to the factors stated above, be driving declines of species like the Grayling.'

Powerscourt Estate is always a good option to take a visitor to and we were lucky when we took a relative there as a beautiful, mild and sunny day further enhanced it.

He was suitably impressed with the grounds, literally going 'wow' as he emerged from the house and had his first glimpse of the gardens elegantly sloping down to the large pond and fountain, the Sugar Loaf forming a majestic backdrop.

At the large pond, known

as Triton Lake, a fallen tree trunk poking out of the water provided a perch for a Cormorant to flex and preen while a Little Grebe floated serenely on the dense water.

A Grey Wagtail, looked like it might be nesting nearby as it flew back and forth into the same patch of undergrowth. It would fly out, land on a water lily and walk across the lilies snatching aquatic insects and returning with them into the bushes.

When Lucy said she thought she was looking at a pair of turtles we presumed she was joking and responded with suitably dismissive utterances. Then she pointed out, on the same semi submerged trunk the cormorant was perched on and just feet away from it, two turtles basking, heads poking from their shells as they faced each other.

It was a sight more suited to the Florida Everglades than the elegant serenity of a Wicklow estate. And apparently Florida is somewhere they're native to as I'm fairly certain they're Yellow Bellied Slider Turtles,

native to the south east United States. These two were almost certainly former pets released (dumped) into the pond, in a monumental act of stupidity by irresponsible owners possibly because they grew too big or their novelty faded. They're already considered an invasive species in Ireland and will feed on native fish and fledglings. Another cause for concern by the turtle's presence is that Powerscourt hosts a population of Smooth Newts, one of Ireland's three native species of amphibian, the others being the Natterjack Toad and the common from

We'd spotted some newts in a small raised fountain in the walled garden on a previous visit a few years ago and earlier on this visit Lucy had spotted newts in one of the murkier ponds in the Japanese garden area. They are terrestrial for most of the year only coming to water to mate and breed but when there they could easily fall prey to a hungry turtle.

Apparently this has already happened in a pond in a college in Dublin where introduced turtles eliminated the newt population from their pond.

In April 1917 under the Paper Restriction Order, it was pointed out that auctioneers could get their posters printed as usual as one of the clauses stated; 'An auctioneer is not a tradesman or retailer in so far as his work as an auctioneer goes, and he may despatch or deliver catalogues and exhibit posters of auction sales at the premises where the sale is to be and elsewhere.' The aim of the Order was to prevent the unnecessary use of paper at a time when paper supplies were needed for the war effort.

'Casualties of Conflict – Fatalities of the War of Independence and Civil War in Glasnevin Cemetery' by Conor Dodd, published by Mercier Press, ISBN: 9781781177280, ills., 340pps.

Conor Dodd is a historian for Dublin Cemeteries Trust and manages its heritage and education department within the Experience Glasnevin visitor centre in Glasnevin Cemetery. He is a graduate of University College Dublin and Maynooth University and is currently studying at Trinity College Dublin.

This excellent and fascinating book explores the lives and deaths of over 300 men, women and children buried in Dublin's Glasnevin Cemetery who died due to the War of Independence and Civil War. Some are well known such as members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, Dublin Metropolitan Police, Irish Volunteers, I.R.A., the Citizen Army, the National Army, and Republicans. But others are lesser known individuals who lost their lives during these two conflicts. The final casualty listed is

National Army Pte. Francis McGinley who was accidentally shot by a colleague in Co. Mayo on May 5<sup>th</sup> 1923.

Following detailed research, the stories of over 300 individuals are told together for the first time, giving a unique insight into these conflicts with first-hand accounts by those who witnessed and participated in these historical events. Through them, the reader can see and follow the expansion of urban warfare in Dublin, executions, assassinations, the Connaught Rangers mutiny in India, rural ambushes, Bloody Sunday, the Battle of Dublin, seaborne landings, the Kerry offensive, extra-judicial shootings and official executions of the Civil War and much more.

The connections between events, personalities and deaths is also clear throughout, showing, at times, the parochial nature of the conflicts with their chains of events, actions and reactions.

Superbly illustrated with numerous photographs, this is an excellent book and one which anyone interested in the War of Independence or Civil War must have in their collection.

# **Driving Tests Delays**

Driving test applicants are experiencing the longest delays to do their driving test at the Dun Laoghaire/Deansgrange Test Centre compared with any other centre in the country, according to statistics released to the Aontú political party, following a parliamentary question to the Department of Transport.

"The delays in Dun Laoghaire are not merely due to higher numbers of applicants, as the Finglas Test Centre has more tests scheduled and a greater volume of applications. Provisional drivers on learner permits can expect to wait 42 weeks after applying to do their test here. When we compare this to the Thurles Test Centre in Co. Tipperary which has a mere 10 week waiting period, we see the true extent of the backlog.

We need to tackle this backlog immediately and we need an even distribution of the applicants throughout the test centres. Applicants should be informed if it is the case that they would be dealt with quicker at another test centre. While this area is well serviced for the most part with public transport, anyone applying for a driver's licence needs to be able to do their test without excessive delays. Having to bring a fully qualified driver with you in the passenger seat can be a huge burden or hassle to a family member or indeed may prevent a provisional driver from being able to take their car and making that journey.

Forty-two weeks is a shocking amount of time to wait for a test. I would also argue that local people in Dun Laoghaire should be prioritised when it comes to testing, ahead of those who have travelled from other parts of Dublin who are served by other test centres. The Department of Transport has said there will be 75 new testers across the country by October, after a recruitment process and training period. This isn't enough to clear the current backlog. Aontú would call for a significant portion of these testers to be deployed to Dun Laoghaire given that it is the test centre in the country with the longest waiting time".

With the help of DLRCC, the aim is to have a wide variety of pollinating plants, hedges and trees in place. Some planting has already started. Bee and butterfly boxes have also been donated by DTT. The next phase will involve our neighbours – increasing the number of pollinating plants at home to form local Bee and Butterfly corridors extending from Sorrento Park.
