



❖ DALKEY CASTLE & HERITAGE CENTRE UPDATE

Dalkey was trending on the world stage a few weeks ago, when some local street art featured on the set of the Pretenders at Glastonbury, one of the biggest music festivals in the world.

In a laneway off Castle Street, there is a piece of street art/graffiti that features a young boy with an oversized pair of boxing gloves and a black patch over one eye. The mural had largely passed unnoticed for fifteen years until Chrissie Hynde of the Pretenders visited Dalkey last summer. She spotted the artwork and contacted its creator, street artist, Solus. And hey presto, there it was on the backdrop of the set for The Pretenders in Glastonbury.

Solus's real name is Derek O'Sullivan. He is an award-winning street artist. The work is called *The Boxing Baby*. In a recent interview in *The Sunday Times*, Derek describes the art (and the role of the artist) as "a boy in a man's world, overcoming obstacles and life.... having to put on a performance every day is a battle, hence the boxing gloves." It's a theme he still uses in his work. Chrissie, lead singer of the Pretenders, felt it matched the band's ethos, "to keep doing it, (creating music). You never retire. You become relentless". Derek's artwork will adorn the cover of The Pretenders next album called *Relentless* later this year.

Dalkey's associations with music go right back to the late 1500s and the musician John Dowland. There is a plaque (another form of street art) to him in the south-east corner of Sorrento Park. Designed by artist Sarah Purser, the plaque was installed in 1937. It is set high up on a rock, facing out to Europe and the sea.

Hugh Leonard has a wonderful description of being in Sorrento Park when the plaque was unveiled: "Until it was shown to the public, it was hidden from view by a cloth cover. However, a group of curious young lads, myself included, could not wait to look upon it. As the rest of us watched, one of our number climbed up ...and disappeared behind the cloth. He re-emerged with a disgusted look on his face...It's only a bloody oul' nun playing the banjo."

John Dowland was born in 1563. Irish composer and musicologist, W.H. Grattan Flood, says that he was born in Dalkey, but there isn't any definite proof. In any event, it is known that he left England in 1594, and became lutenist to the King of Denmark. He dedicated his famous *Lachrimae* to Queen Anne of Denmark.

Dowland was known in all the royal courts of Europe. He was the Bono of his day. Sting, who recently played a sell-out gig with Blondie at Malahide Castle has revived Dowland's compositions. It's well known that James Joyce was influenced by Dowland's music. The poems in his first collection of poetry, *Chamber Music*, are modelled on the rhythms and melancholic mood of Dowland's verse.

Dowland was a friend William Shakespeare. It is said that the rocky shore at Coliemore Harbour fed into Shakespeare's description of the cliffs at Elsinore in *Hamlet*.

To add further to serendipity, there is a beautiful house called Elsinore near Coliemore Harbour. It was here that U2 recorded tracks for their album *Achtung Baby* in 1991. The opening track *Zoo Station*, along with *The Fly* and *Ultraviolet* are said to have sprung from this session.



Like Dowland, Bono is known in all the courts of Europe, and beyond. He frequently puts Dalkey on the Map. Most recently, during the Dalkey Book Festival, he and Fintan O'Toole discussed their respective books (*Surrender* and *We Don't Know Ourselves*) in Dalkey Church with David McWilliams. (photo).

In Surrender, Bono describes how U2, and the Northern Ireland band Ash, helped to set up a photo with David Trimble and John Hume at the Waterfront to boost the Yes vote for the Belfast Agreement in 1998. He writes "In the dressing room I had one halfgood idea that turned out great." When the two leaders emerged from opposite wings of the Waterfront Hall stage, he took each of their hands and raised them in triumph. The iconic photo of the two leaders with Bono in the middle, like a boxing referee raising the victors' arms, went around the world on the Newswires. The Referendum passed with a resounding 71 per cent of votes cast in favour of the peace accord.

There are other musicians living in our midst who are known on the world stage. Among them are Barry Devlin and Enya. Barry Devlin was bass player, vocalist and front man in Irish Celtic rock band Horslips. Formed in Dublin in 1970, they sought their inspiration in Irish history and folklore. By the time they disbanded in 1980, they had an impressive 10 studio albums. They reformed in 2009 and have continued to play occasional shows since.

Donegal born, and now living close by, Enya is the biggest-selling Irish solo artist and one of the best-selling music artists of all time, with more than 51 million albums. She is probably best known for *Orinoco Flow*. She has also recorded *A Day Without Rain* which, by an amazing co-incidence, was the title of one of Dowland's compositions.

NATURE CORNER Michael Ryan

When we first saw this plant we thought it was a fading orchid later discovering it was Ivy Broomrape, Orobanche hederae. It is parasitic, deriving nutrition from the roots of ivy. It doesn't produce any chlorophyll and though individual plants are variable in colour it has no green pigment. Although the plants photographed here were growing near Inistioge we originally saw it in Dalkey and on Zoe Devlin's website she states 'this plant was recorded between 1893-1902 by Nathaniel Colgan in his Flora of the County Dublin (1904) and one of the locations given at that time was a 'drift bank by the sea below Killinev Hill'. '



One of our previous visits to Emo Court was during lockdown restrictions. There would normally have been guided tours of the house itself but due to Covid restrictions they couldn't take place but instead they did offer a guided tour around the grounds and the walled garden which was being restored. Our volunteer guide was very pleasant and informative and we got to chatting about wildlife there. Previously we'd seen red squirrels and woodpeckers as well

as finding owl pellets at the base of one of the majestic giant redwoods which border the mile long avenue. The guide said there was a nest box up for barn owls which I believe has been successfully occupied. But then said that they also planned on installing

bee hives which concerned me but I didn't get a chance to voice my reservations to her as the tour was ending. Honey bees in hives are basically livestock, most of the bees kept in hives aren't native and can compete for nectar and pollen with existing native species of pollinators like bumblebees, hover flies and many other insects.

Later at the information desk I told them about the wildlife we'd seen and they suggested we send in the pics for their website. They expressed gratitude when I sent a few pics later but when I replied voicing reservations about the wisdom of introducing bee hives, accompanied by some articles supporting my negative opinion I didn't receive any reply.

I don't know if they went ahead with the hives, we didn't see any when we visited in June this year. We

were walking around the path around the lake when someone coming from the opposite direction warned us there was a wasp's nest at the base of a beech tree. But it wasn't a wasps nest, it was a nest of native honey bees, *Apis Mellifera*.

Always nice to see these little creatures, until recently thought to be almost extinct but then happily found to be doing really well with Ireland a stronghold in Europe for them.

Continuing the walk a busy buzzing from another tree alerted us to yet another nest of native bees, this time at the fork of the tree. Delighted to see a second nest then a minute

or two later more buzzing and yet another nest. Whatever my concerns were about imported bees there was certainly no shortage of native bees in the grounds. Surprised so many nests were so close together remembering there were also quite a few nests of native honey bees situated close together in the grounds of Johnstown Castle in Wexford. Happy having seen so many thriving bees

though slightly disappointed at not seeing any red squirrels until as we were leaving along the driveway through the extensive woodlands Lucy spotted one rooting around on the ground. Incidentally if you are thinking of visiting Emo Court the house is now closed indefinitely for renovations but the very extensive grounds are well worth a visit. And it's free.





Crab spiders, which can be yellow, above left, or white seem to have an innate knowledge of what plants are attractive to pollinators such as the buddleia, above right. The white crab spider stood out fairly obviously on the buddleia so would conceal itself beneath the flowers.

Dalkey - Looking Back

On Friday January 4th 1935, an inquest jury sitting in St. Michael's Hospital, Dun Laoghaire, with Coroner Dr. J. Brennan, returned a verdict that a 59-year man from Carysford Road, Dalkey, died the previous day from a fractured skull which he sustained during a moment of temporary insanity after he head butted the front head lamps of a bus in Castle Street. He then threw himself under a car further down Castle Street in the early hours of Thursday January 3rd. Both the bus driver and car driver were exonerated from all blame while family members were at a complete loss and unable to provide a motive for his actions.

Captain Birch & R.M.S. Leinster

Captain Birch did not go down with his ship as stated in the July Dalkey Castle & Heritage Centre Update. While supervising the launching of lifeboats, Captain Birch was blown off his ship and into the sea by the second torpedo explosion receiving head injuries and a broken leg in the process. Spotted floating in the sea by the occupants of a lifeboat, they were unable to pull him in on board and he was unable to pull himself into it. So he held onto the edge of the lifeboat. When HMS Mallard neared the lifeboat to rescue its occupants, those onboard all moved to one side in error and capsized it. Captain Birch lost his grip and drowned - his body was never recovered.

'The Hales Brothers and the Irish Revolution' by Liz Gillis, published by Mercier Press, ISBN 978178117356


The story of the Hales family from Bandon epitomises the whole revolutionary period in Ireland. They were involved from the establishment of the Irish Volunteers in West Cork and were closely associated with well-known revolutionary figures, including Michael Collins, Tom Barry

and Liam Deasy. Both Seán and Tom were company commanders in the IRA in the area. The signing of the Anglo-Irish Treaty in December 1921 split the family and led to the two brothers taking opposing sides in the Civil War that would follow.

Tom Hales was the most senior Republican officer on the scene of the chaotic ambush at Béal na mBláth that led to the shooting of Michael Collins while Seán Hales was himself assassinated in Dublin by Republicans, following a vote in Dáil Éireann to allow the Provisional Government to increase its powers to penalise Republican prisoners.

The story of these brothers and the rest of the family give a unique insight into life in Ireland in this tumultuous period.

The sun was shining and iced coffees were most popular. The many dogs in attendance enjoyed bowls of iced water and doggie treats. It was great to see so many working dogs, along with several pups in training with their handlers. A lot of waggy tails!

It costs over €50,000 to fully train a working dog and every year approximately 80 dogs are matched with clients, either as guide dogs for blind and vision impaired, or assistance dogs for children with additional needs.

As a person who is blind, I can testify how special it is to have been matched with my guide dog four years ago. I have greater independence and mobility, than when I just used a white cane, I equate it with the difference between riding a bicycle or being driven by a chauffeur! My dog not only keeps me safe as I go about, but also provides invaluable companionship. I have made wonderful new friends through having a guide dog.

Q. My daughter is complaining of an itchy bottom and I saw a white threadworm in her stools when she went to the toilet. What is the best way to treat this?

*

A. Threadworms are a common childhood infection of the large intestine and are most often found in children under ten. The worms are white and look like a piece of thread and may be visible in a child's bottom or in their poo. They may not have any symptoms but often the main symptom is itching in the bottom or vagina especially at night. This may result in disturbed sleep.

A severe infection can cause symptoms of loss of appetite, weight loss, insomnia and bedwetting.

The worms lay their eggs at night and if scratched the eggs can lie under the fingernails and get re ingested which starts a new infection cycle. They can survive on surfaces for up to two weeks so it is important if an infection is discovered that all surfaces and bed linen, pyjamas etc. are disinfected.

Treatment is very straightforward and does not require a visit to the GP. Your Pharmacist can advise on the products and hygiene procedures needed to successfully treat the infection. A GP visit is only needed if you are pregnant or the child is under the age of 2.

Mebendazole is the medication used to treat threadworm and is available over the counter without prescription. The standard treatment is one dose initially followed by a second dose two weeks later. Everyone in the family should be treated at the same time.

The hygiene measures are important to ensure reinfection does not occur and should be followed for up to 6 weeks after treatment.

They are as follows:

- Wash all night clothes, bed linen, towels and soft toys at 60°C on diagnosis
- Avoid shaking any items that may be contaminated as this will spread the eggs in the air.
- Vacuum and mop the whole house but especially the bedrooms and bathrooms
- Wash hands frequently with warm soapy water especially under the nails particularly after going to the toilet
- Keep fingernails short and discourage nail biting or finger sucking
- Wear tight fitting underwear at night and change first thing in the morning washing them well
- Do not share towels and shower/bath regularly

Children do not need to be kept out of school or crèche but they should be informed so the proper hygiene procedures can be followed.

Your Pharmacist should be able to provide all advice needed for the management of threadworms.

❖ CHURCHES' CREATION CARE INITIATIVES - ECO WORDS

We are waking every day to more news about vanishing species, our dangerously warming world and the impact of all this on the parts of the world most deeply affected. Members of our churches in and around Dalkey, have been challenged recently to take determined action in this area while there is still time.

The challenge came at the May 9th inter-church event in Our Lady's Hall at which Des Burke-Kennedy of Dalkey Tidy Towns spoke on the theme "Never mind the next world - Let's fix this one". As a result, some action is now being considered in both our Dalkey churches, parishioners being encouraged to consider and suggest ways we can share in all manner of eco-friendly activity. Registration as members of the Ireland wide organisation Eco Congregation Ireland is now on the agenda of both Dalkey parishes - a step already taken by Holy Trinity Killiney and Our Lady of Good Counsel Johnstown, both of which have benefitted greatly from ECI advice. Our inspiration goes back to Canon Andrew Orr's "Churches Caring for Creation" talk in the Town Hall in September last year. Once we enrol as ECI members we might host the 'Climate Justice Candle' in each church to show our commitment to 'creation care'. (Check https://www.ecocongregationireland.

Representatives of both parishes have met together and are planning two events in the Heritage Centre / Town Hall: in the early autumn, a viewing of *the Laudato Sí film "The Letter"*; then an ecumenical service in St. Begnet's graveyard on or around St. Francis' feast day of October 4th, which falls in the harvest season now known as "Creation-tide".

Sustainability is a broad remit; Eco Congregation Ireland guidelines include looking at our natural world to allow native flowers, insects, birds, animals and trees to thrive; re-thinking and adjusting energy and carbon use in our buildings and grounds; and enabling easier access to our buildings for cyclists, walkers and low energy transport.

Our faith is becoming increasingly alive to creation and we have charge of our small part of it. And we are beginning to "do" as well as "talk". For instance, the children and teachers at St. Patrick's school have been exploring various creation-friendly opportunities this summer, encouraging biodiversity in the rectory garden. The story of the orchid in Trinity College caught our imagination. We cherish our green spaces around our churches. Could they become more adapted to meditative practice and more encouraging to nature and the species we have lost?

However individual activity is every bit as important as communal, as Des Burke-Kennedy's list of potential projects points out. What is each one of us doing in our own house and garden and road frontage to reverse increasing pollution, attract the birds and the bees, and encourage others to do the same?


